## News and Notes

Manhattan will appear before a national audience for the eighth time this season when ESPN rolls its trucks up to Draddy Gymnasium for Senior Night against Fairfield. The contest was selected by ESPN as one of two games to be televised as part of the MAAC Wildcard agreement with the network.

The Jaspers won their last game that was televised on ESPNU upending local MAAC rival Iona 74-73 in double overtime on Feb. 15. Junior forward Rhamel Brown scored 21 points, grabbed 17 rebounds and blocked seven shots to lead Manhattan to the victory. With 11 seconds remaining and the Jaspers trailing by one point, Brown corralled his 10th offensive rebound of the contest, which set the stage for Emmy Andujar's game winning layup.

Prior to the contest, Manhattan will honor graduating seniors Roberto Colonette and Mohamed Koita for their contributions to the basketball program. Colonette and Koita will be presented framed jerseys and will be recognized in a pregame ceremony with head coach Steve Masiello scheduled to take the microphone for a moment to say a few words about his seniors.

Manhattan has won five of its last six games, which includes a season-best four game win streak from Feb. 3 - 15. The Jaspers are coming off a 65-64 victory at Buffalo on Saturday in the ESPN Ramada BracketBuster. It marked the fifth straight year the Jaspers won their BracketBuster contest.

Freshman forward Shane Richards led Manhattan in scoring for the sixth time this season, finishing with 14 points and hitting four three-pointers against Buffalo. Sophomore guard RaShawn Stores matched a career-high, posting 13 points by going 8-for-10 from the free-throw line. Michael Alvarado registered 11 points and Emmy Andujar had nine with a team-high four assists.

Manhattan will be distributing white Jaspers rally towels to fans for the final home contest of the regular-season. The 6th Borough, the Manhattan College Student Section, will be holding a 'White Out' with new 6th Borough jersey-style t-shirts, along with neon glow stick pompoms. Big Head cut outs of the Manhattan players and head coach Steve Masiello will be on display in The 6th Borough.

# 2012-2013 Manhattan Men's Basketball Game Notes

## Scouting Report Manhattan

The Jaspers are 5-1 in their last six games, including their most recent 65-64 victory at Buffalo on Saturday in the ESPN Ramada BracketBuster. Freshman forward Shane Richards led Manhattan in scoring for the sixth time this season, posting 14 points with four three-pointers. It was Richards' 10th double-digit scoring effort of the year.

Manhattan won three of its four home games in February. The Jaspers picked up a thrilling double-overtime victory over Iona on Feb. 15 with junior forward Rhamel Brown going off for 21 points, 17 rebounds and seven blocks. Brown ranks eighth in the nation averaging 3.04 blocks per game, and he is two blocks away from tying the program's single season record that he set last year (84). Brown also leads the MAAC with a 56.0% field goal shooting percentage and he is fifth averaging 7.1 rebounds per game.

The Jaspers have also relied on sophomore forward Donovan Kates who has scored in double-figures in five of the last six games. Kates exploded for a game-high 17 points in the Jaspers' 62-40 victory over Fairfield at Alumni Hall on Feb. 12, posting 15 points in the second half. In the last five MAAC games, Kates has helped the Jaspers post a 4-1 record averaging 13.0 points and shooting 47.8% (11-23) from three-point range.

Manhattan's backcourt features junior point guard Michael Alvarado and sophomore point guard RaShawn Stores. The former high school teammates at All Hallows each scored in double-figures on Saturday in the Jaspers' win at Buffalo. They have combined for 118 assists this year, nearly have of Manhattan's total. Stores earned two of his three MAAC Rookie of the Week Awards during the Jaspers' hot streak in February. Stores averaged 8.3 points and shot 46.4% from the field helping Manhattan to a 5-2 record during the month. He matched a career-high with 13 points in victories over Canisius (Feb. 7) and Buffalo (Feb. 23).

Sophomore forward Emmy Andujar has also played some of his best basketball of the season in February. Andujar has averaged 9.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and 3.2 assists in the seven games. He scored 15 points to help lead Manhattan to its last win at Draddy Gymnasium against Iona. He converted the game winning layup with only seconds remaining. Andujar leads Manhattan with 67 assists on the season.

Manhattan enters the final weekend of the regular-season fighting to finish in the top-6 of the MAAC standings to avoid playing an extra game in the opening round of the MAAC Tournament. The Jaspers control their own destiny to secure a top-6 seed by winning the last two contests over Fairfield and Loyola.

## Fairfield

The Stags have gone 2-2 in their last four games since Manhattan snapped their five-game win streak on Feb. 12 at Alumni Hall. Fairfield is coming off a 58-50 loss to Albany in the ESPN Ramada BracketBuster on Saturday in Bridgeport, Conn. The Stags have been without senior guard Desmond Wade, the team's assist leader (3.8 apg), who has missed the last four games due to injury.

Fairfield is led by senior guard Derek Needham who has averaged 14.9 points per game this season. Needham's 68 three-pointers are the fourth most in the MAAC this season.

Stags' junior forward Maurice Barrow has come off the bench in all 16 MAAC contests. He is averaging 10.9 points shooting 51.2% from the field and has pulled down 5.2 rebounds per game. Freshman forward Amadou Sidibe, a 6'8" product of Cardinal Hayes High School in the Bronx, has also been a force in the post. Sidibe has started all 16 MAAC games and has posted a team-high 6.2 rebounds against conference opponents, going along with 5.8 points per game.

Fairfield (40.2% fg % def.) and Manhattan (38.4% fg % def.) are the top two defensive teams in the conference. They have each allowed only 58 points per game in MAAC contests.

## Last Game

**Manhattan 65, Buffalo 64**  
February 23, 2013  
Buffalo, N.Y. - Alumni Arena

The red-hot Jaspers picked up their fifth win in six games as Manhattan rallied for a 65-64 road victory over Buffalo on Saturday. Freshman forward Shane Richards buried four three-pointers, finishing with a team-high 14 points, to lift Manhattan to a victory in the ESPN Ramada BracketBuster series for the fifth straight year.

Manhattan's defense stepped up to the occasion nursing a one point advantage on the last possession of the ballgame. Junior forward Javon McCrea collected his game-high 11th rebound on the defensive end to get the Bulls off and running without a timeout.

Jaspers' sophomore guard RaShawn Stores put two hands in the face of Bulls' senior guard Tony Watson preventing a potential game-winning three. Watson double clutched and then pushed the ball in the direction of freshman guard Jarryn Skeete, whose contested heave at the buzzer was short.

Stores registered a career-high 13 points shooting 8-for-10 from the free-throw line in his sixth double-digit scoring performance of the year. Manhattan also received 11 points and four rebounds from junior point guard Michael Alvarado. Jaspers' sophomore forward Emmy Andujar contributed nine points, four rebounds and a team-high four assists.

Manhattan used a 16-2 run to take control of the game in the second half. The Jaspers scored eight straight points during the spurt as Alvarado tied the contest at 38 with a three-point play. Stores then buried a three-pointer 49 seconds later to put Manhattan on top 41-38 at 17:09.

Richards capped off the scoring surge with consecutive threes. His fourth trey of the game came at 13:50 to give Manhattan its largest lead, 49-40. The Jaspers did not trail the rest of the way.

## Last Meeting

**Manhattan 62, Fairfield 40**  
February 12, 2013  
Fairfield, Conn. - Alumni Hall

The Jaspers rolled to a 62-40 victory over Fairfield at Alumni Hall on Feb. 12. Sophomore forward Donovan Kates had 15 of his game-high 17 points in the second half helping Manhattan snap the Stags' five game win streak. It was the Jaspers fourth win in five contests.

Manhattan delivered a dominant all-around performance. The Jaspers shot 52.3% (23-44) from the field, while holding the Stags to a 25.4% field goal mark. Fairfield's 40 points were the fewest Manhattan has allowed this season.

Jaspers' sophomore forward Emmy Andujar scored 13 points on 6-for-8 shooting. He added a game-high five assists and six rebounds to his stat line. Junior forward Rhamel Brown engraved his name in Manhattan's record book as he swatted three shots to become the career blocks leader. Brown surpassed Jasper great Steve Grant (1974-78) who held the record for 35 years.

Manhattan unleashed a 22-0 run that lasted 10:31 in the first half to take a 26-8 lead by the 4:29 mark. Fairfield had only 13 points at halftime.

The Jaspers held a 24-point lead in the second half with Kates first of two three-pointers. The Hopkinsville, Ky. native also shot a perfect 7-for-7 from the free-throw line.

Sophomore guard RaShawn Stores added seven points, contributing to a Manhattan bench effort that outscored the Stags' reserves 32-12.

## Series History

Manhattan and Fairfield will meet for the 90th time in series history with the Jaspers holding a 46-43 advantage all-time. The Jaspers snapped a six game losing streak to the Stags with their 53-51 victory in their last meeting at Draddy Gymnasium on Jan. 8, 2012. George Beamon scored a game-high 16 points and Emmy Andujar scored 10 points on 4-for-6 shooting to give Manhattan its first win over the Stags in three years. Andujar grabbed four rebounds and dished out three assists.

- ▶ Manhattan is tied for the league lead in scoring defense, holding MAAC opponents to 58 points per game this season
  - ▶▶ Manhattan has the top spot in the league for field goal percentage defense, limiting MAAC opponents to a 38.4% mark
  - ▶▶ The Jaspers have held 8 of their last 10 opponents below 40% shooting from the field
  - ▶▶ On Feb. 12, the Jaspers limited Fairfield to a season best 25.4% (15-59) field goal mark
  - ▶▶ The Jaspers have held 14 of the last 16 opponents to fewer than 70 points, a stretch that began Jan. 1
  - ▶▶ Manhattan has kept teams below 70 points in 14 of 16 MAAC contests
  - ▶▶ The Jaspers have held 7 MAAC opponents in the 50s, and 2 opponents in the 40s
  - ▶▶ Fairfield's 40 points on Feb. 12 were the fewest Manhattan has allowed all season
- ▶ Manhattan had its top shooting effort of the season, converting 54.8% (23-42) of its field goal attempts at Draddy Gymnasium on Feb. 7, rolling past Canisius, 67-54
  - ▶▶ The Jaspers opened their largest lead of the season (27) in the second half against the Canisius (Feb. 7)
- ▶ Rhamel Brown set the program's career blocks record (234) at Fairfield on Feb. 12 with three blocks
  - ▶▶ Brown surpassed Steve Grant (220, 1974-78)
  - ▶▶ Brown leads the MAAC and is 8th nationally with 3.04 blocks per game
  - ▶▶ He is 10th in the NCAA for active leaders in career blocks
  - ▶▶ Brown also leads the MAAC with a 56.0% field goal pct.
  - ▶▶ He is shooting a league best 58.7% from the field in MAAC games
  - ▶▶ Brown ranks 5th in the MAAC averaging 7.1 rebounds
- ▶ Freshman forward Shane Richards hit 42 of his 56 team-high three-point field goals against MAAC opponents, and has posted 9.7 points per game appearing in all 16 MAAC games
  - ▶▶ Richards buried 6 three-pointers at Barclays Center on Dec. 22 vs. South Carolina, he sank 6 threes again on Jan. 10 versus Rider at Draddy Gymnasium, and knocked down 6 more threes at Canisius on Jan. 17
  - ▶▶ Richards has scored in double-figures in 8 of the last 13 games, including a career-high 19 points in a win at Rider (Jan. 27)
  - ▶▶ Richards has led Manhattan in scoring 6 times
- ▶ Junior forward Rhamel Brown has scored double-figures in 12 of 16 MAAC games
  - ▶▶ Brown held a streak of 8 games where he posted double-digits in the scoring column from Dec. 22 through Jan. 17
  - ▶▶ Brown scored a career-high 25 points at Columbia (Dec. 29)
- ▶ Manhattan is averaging 64.9 points in its 11 victories
  - ▶▶ The Jaspers have shot 45.6% in wins and held opponents to a 36.9% field goal mark
  - ▶▶ They have outrebounded opponents +4.2 in wins and have averaged a 9.8-point margin of victory
- ▶ Manhattan had the top turnaround in the nation with a 15-win improvement last year (all at NCAA Division I level) coming off a 6-25 overall record in 2010-11

## A February to Remember

Manhattan went 5-2 in February capping the month with a road victory at Buffalo, edging the Bulls 65-64 on Saturday. The Jaspers played their best basketball in February, delivering some of their top performances of the season in wins over Canisius (Feb. 7), Fairfield (Feb. 12) and Iona (Feb. 15). Manhattan averaged a 12.0-point margin of victory in those three wins.

The Jaspers ran away with a wire-to-wire victory over Canisius at Draddy Gymnasium and opened a season-high 27 point lead in the second half. Manhattan shot a season best 54.8% from the field against the Golden Griffins in a balance scoring attack that featured four Jaspers scoring in double-figures, including a team-high 14 points from sophomore forward Donovan Kates.

Manhattan put its top defensive performance on display in its largest margin of victory of the year at Fairfield (62-40) on Feb. 12. The Jaspers held the Stags to the fewest points they allowed this season, along with keeping Fairfield to a season-low 25.4% field goal percentage defense.

The Jaspers' double overtime victory against Iona goes down as one of the most memorable games in Draddy Gymnasium history. Manhattan junior forward Rhamel Brown had arguably the top individual all-around performance by a MAAC player this season as he went for 21 points, a career-high 17 rebounds and blocked a career-high 7 shots. It was his 10th offensive rebound of the ballgame off a missed free-throw with 11 seconds remaining that set the stage for Emmy Andujar's game-winning layup (74-73).

## Home Court Advantage

The Jaspers have gone 5-3 in MAAC games at Draddy Gymnasium this season. Manhattan enters its meeting with Fairfield winning three of the last four home games. Junior forward Rhamel Brown leads the team averaging 15.8 points shooting 64.7% from the field and with 7.8 rebounds per game in the Jaspers' 10 games in Riverdale this season.

Manhattan's defense has limited opponents to 57.0 points per game, a 36.8% field goal percentage and a 28.9% three-point field goal mark at Draddy Gymnasium this year. The Jaspers have not given up more than 60 points in regulation in the last six home games, a stretch that began on Jan. 13. Manhattan held Iona, the third highest scoring team in the nation (80.3 ppg), to only 58 points at the end of regulation, before topping the Gaels 74-73 in double overtime.

## Manhattan Rallies Behind Veteran Floor General

Junior co-captain Michael Alvarado has been a key contributor to the Jaspers success as of late since his return to the starting lineup on Jan. 27 in a 62-51 road victory at Rider. Alvarado worked his way back from an ankle injury he suffered on Jan. 1 against Stony Brook that sidelined the point guard from the Bronx for three games. Manhattan has posted a 6-2 record in the last eight games since he rejoined the starting lineup.

Since his return as a starter, Alvarado has averaged 9.0 points and 2.8 assists per game. He delivered four double-digit scoring performances, and has posted 11 points in each of Manhattan's last two games. Alvarado has converted 85.4% (35-41) of his free-throw attempts.

## Jaspers Peaking; Momentum Building for March Madness

Manhattan has become the hottest team in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference, after winning 6 of its last 8 games. The Jaspers went on a season best four game winning streak from Feb. 3 - 15, which included back-to-back double-digit victories over Canisius (Feb. 7) and Fairfield (Feb. 12). Manhattan has averaged an 8.0-point margin of victory in the last five MAAC contests.

## Defensive Intensity

Manhattan has been the top defensive team in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) this season. The Jaspers are tied with Fairfield for the league lead yielding only 58 points per game against conference opponents. Manhattan has the best field goal defense (38.4%) versus the MAAC.

The Jaspers' active defense revolves around the MAAC's reigning Defensive Player of the Year Rhamel Brown who leads the league for the third straight year in blocked shots (3.04). Brown is averaging 3.8 blocks in the Jaspers' 16 conference games, which includes four career-high 7 block performances and one 6 block effort.

Winning 4 of the last 5 MAAC games, the Jaspers have limited opponents to 55.2 points and a 34.8% field goal mark and 30.2% three-point field goal shooting percentage.

## Blocks King

Jaspers' junior forward Rhamel Brown engraved his name in the Manhattan men's basketball record book on Feb. 12, 2013 at Fairfield when he became the program's career blocks leader. Brown surpassed Steve Grant (220, 1974-78) who held the record for 35 years.

The 6'7" forward set the program's single season blocks record last year with 84 rejections, and he has 82 blocks this season. Brown's 2.47 blocks per game average ranked in the top-20 nationally in 2011-2012, leading the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference in this category for the second straight year.

## Jaspers Challenged with Non-League Slate

Manhattan played arguably the most difficult non-conference schedule in the MAAC this season. Coming off a 21-win campaign, returning all five starters and 81.2% of the scoring offense, Manhattan compiled an aggressive non-league slate that featured five teams that advanced to the 2012 postseason and won 20+ games last year (Louisville, Harvard, Dayton, LIU Brooklyn, Stony Brook). The Jaspers did not account for the 2011-12 MAAC scoring champion George Beamon to go down with an ankle injury two days before the opener at Louisville. Despite the setback, Manhattan has fared well, as the team is finding its identity with a roster that features Preseason All-MAAC selections Rhamel Brown, Michael Alvarado and Emmy Andujar. The Jaspers are playing at a higher level since entering the MAAC schedule.

## Jaspers Named MAAC Rookies of the Week

First-year guard RaShawn Stores and freshman Shane Richards have each been named the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Rookie of the Week this season. Stores earned his first of three awards on Dec. 10 after the 5'11" point guard from the Bronx averaged 10.5 points shooting 61.5% (8-13) from the field in two games. He also added nine assists without having a turnover and buried 71.4% (5-7) of his three-point field goal attempts. Stores had his top performance of the week against Siena (Dec. 9) as he helped the Jaspers earn a 75-55 triumph. He set career highs with 12 points and six assists, while shooting a perfect 4-for-4 from three-point territory. Stores also grabbed five rebounds and swiped two steals in 24 minutes off the bench.

Stores earned his second and third MAAC Rookie of the Week Awards in consecutive weeks. On Feb. 4, he garnered the accolade after delivering a 10-point performance to propel Manhattan to a 57-49 win over Saint Peter's on Feb. 3. Then on Feb. 11, Stores received the award after scoring 13 points in a 67-54 victory over Canisius at Draddy Gymnasium.

Richards was selected MAAC Rookie of the Week on Jan. 14. He averaged 14.5 points and buried eight three-pointers in two appearances against Rider (Jan. 10) and Marist (Jan. 13). The 6'5" New York City native exploded for a team-high 18 points before a national audience on ESPN3 versus Rider. He delivered another double-digit scoring performance, finishing with 11 points to help lead Manhattan to a 65-53 victory over Marist.

## Manhattan Inks Three to NLI's

Manhattan signed three highly-touted student-athletes during the NCAA Early Signing Period. Former five-star recruit and elite junior college prospect Chris Thomas (Denver, Colo./Chipola College), along with incoming freshmen, 6'10" center Carlton Allen (Ewing, N.J./Life Center Academy) and 6'0" guard Tyler Wilson (Bronx, N.Y./Cardinal Hayes) signed their National Letters of Intent to play for the Jaspers in 2013-14.

Thomas is 6'5" shooting guard from Colorado who is regarded as one of the purest scorers in the nation with high-major talent. He will come to Manhattan after one season playing at Chipola College for head coach Patrick Blake in Marianna, Fla. Chipola was the preseason fourth-ranked team in the country on the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) poll. Thomas was ranked as the #1 shooting guard and fifth overall prospect by Rivals.com and was an ESPN Super 60 recruit.

Allen comes to Manhattan from Life Center Academy in Burlington, N.J., where he plays for head coach Pervis Ellison, an 11-year NBA veteran. Allen is a 6'10", 240-pound student-athlete who provides a low post scoring threat for the Jaspers. He maneuvers well in the deep post and has a repertoire of inside moves, including the jump hook, according to ESPN.com. ESPN.com also ranks Allen as the 41st player at his position in 2013 class.

Wilson is a speedy guard who handles the ball well and is a legitimate scoring threat. He helped lead Cardinal Hayes to the Catholic High School Athletic Association (CHSAA) Class AA intersectional semifinals as a junior. He averaged approximately 12 points and seven assists per game last year, after playing two years at Rice High School.

## MAAC Player of the Week Honors

Manhattan senior guard George Beamon was named MAAC Player of the Week on Nov. 26 after averaging 24.0 points and 5.5 rebounds in the two contests against Hofstra and Dayton. Beamon shot 64% (16-25) from the field and 81.3% (13-16) at the free-throw line, making a seamless transition back into the starting lineup after missing the Jaspers' first two contests with an injury.

Beamon exploded for 29 points and grabbed seven rebounds to lead Manhattan to a 67-56 victory over Hofstra. He shot 10-for-15 (66.7%) from the field and it was his 19th career 20+point performance.

The Roslyn, N.Y., native continued his superb play at Dayton as he delivered his 50th straight double-figure scoring effort. Beamon finished with 19 points, four rebounds, three assists and three steals. He was 6-for-10 (60%) from the field and 6-for-6 at the free-throw line.

## Beamon Among Top Returning Scorers in Nation

Manhattan guard George Beamon entered his final season in Riverdale ranked among the top returning scorers in the country. Beamon, the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference's (MAAC) reigning scoring champion, has finished in the top-3 of the league's chart the last two years. The 6'4" native of Roslyn, N.Y., averaged a career-high 19.0 points per game last season, which has landed him 7th place among all returning players in NCAA Division I. Beamon's 2011-2012 scoring average is also the 6th highest among returning seniors for the 2012-2013 campaign.

## Manhattan Top of the Heap in Media Polls

After only one season with Steve Masiello at the helm, Manhattan was picked to finish the 2012-13 campaign atop the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC), a position the program was familiar with during his time as an assistant coach (2001-2005). According to Yahoo! Sports and CBSSports.com, the Jaspers are the MAAC's preseason favorite. CBSSports.com also had Manhattan senior guard George Beamon as the projected conference Player of the Year.

## Manhattan Second on MAAC Preseason Poll

Manhattan garnered its highest preseason ranking in seven years on the annual MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Jaspers were selected to finish as the league's runner up in 2012-13 as announced on ESPN3. Manhattan received two first place votes, and was eight points behind preseason favorite Loyola, the defending conference champion.

## Preseason All-MAAC Honors

Manhattan had a league-best four players selected to the 2012-13 Preseason All-MAAC Team. Senior guard George Beamon was named to the First Team, while juniors Michael Alvarado, Rhamel Brown and sophomore Emmy Andujar received Third Team honors. These four Jaspers combined for 60% of the team's scoring last season and more than 50% of rebounding and assists for a squad that won 21-games.

Beamon is a two-time All-MAAC selection who was named to the First Team last year after leading the MAAC in scoring with 19.0 points per game. He posted double-figures in the scoring column in all 33 appearances in 2011-12 and led the team in points 26 times. Beamon ranked in the top-25 nationally for scoring average, and he finished in the top-10 of the MAAC for field goal percentage (48.5% - 10th), free-throw shooting (80.1% - 4th), steals (1.5 - 6th), three-point field goal percentage (42.7% - 4th) and three-point field goals (61 - 9th). Beamon scored 1,131 points in the previous two seasons.

Alvarado, a junior guard, was named to the All-MAAC Third Team in 2011-12. He started 26 of 30 appearances and tied for second on the team in scoring (8.5) and assists per game (3.2), which was also the sixth best average in the MAAC. Alvarado ranked among the leaders in the conference with a 76.6% free-throw percentage.

Brown is a 6'7" forward who earned the MAAC Defensive Player of the Year award last season. Brown led the MAAC with 2.5 blocks per game. He appeared in all 34 games for the Jaspers averaging 7.9 points and 4.9 rebounds in 19.1 minutes per game. He ranked second in the MAAC with a 60.1% field goal percentage.

Andujar was a MAAC All-Rookie Team selection in 2011-12. He started 32 of 33 appearances tying for second on the team in scoring with Alvarado (8.5 ppg). The 6'6" forward dished out a team-high 105 assists and led Manhattan with 189 rebounds.

## Manhattan Staff

Manhattan second-year head coach Steve Masiello reloaded his coaching staff for the 2012-2013 season after former assistants Scott Padgett and Rashon Burno earned elevated coaching positions at other NCAA Division I institutions. During the offseason, Padgett was named associate head coach at Samford University in Birmingham, Ala., and Burno became an assistant coach under two-time national championship head coach Billy Donovan at the University of Florida.

The Jaspers current staff still features Associate Head Coach Matt Grady, who enters his second season in Riverdale. He brings a plethora of high level collegiate experience from his time at Louisville, Cincinnati, Murray State and Morehead State. Grady oversees the primary scouting and game planning responsibilities. "Matt is one of the best basketball minds out there," says Masiello.

Masiello reunited with assistant coach Rasheen Davis, who joined the staff in April. Davis came to Riverdale from Xavier, where he spent the previous two years as an assistant coach on Chris Mack's staff. Davis helped the Musketeers to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, including a run to the Sweet Sixteen in 2011-12. He joined the Division I coaching ranks in 2007-08 as a program assistant at Louisville under head coach Rick Pitino and Masiello, who was an assistant on the staff.

Oliver Antigua is the third assistant on the Jaspers' staff. He joined the program in June after a successful career at St. Raymond High School in the Bronx, where he coached the Ravens to five Catholic High School Athletic Association (CHSAA) Class AA championships over his 13-year tenure. Antigua's brother Orlando is an assistant coach at Kentucky.

## Jaspers in the Hall

Coinciding with the MAAC Championships moving to the MassMutual Center in Springfield, Mass., through 2014, a 600-square foot permanent display dedicated to the conference opened at the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in October 2011. The MAAC Experience includes historical items and artifacts from the MAAC's rich 32-year history. In addition, all 10 MAAC schools have their own display within the exhibit. Manhattan's display features a commemorative No. 23 jersey worn by former Manhattan player, coach and athletic director Jack Powers '58, the former Executive Director of the NIT. Powers was Manhattan's first men's basketball inductee to the MAAC Honor Roll in March at the 2012 MAAC Championships.

The 2013 MAAC Honor Roll Class will feature Manhattan standout Keith Bullock '93 who will be inducted into The MAAC Experience exhibit this March during the MAAC Tournament. The 1990 MAAC Rookie of the Year, Bullock helped lead a renaissance of Manhattan basketball. He was a key starter on the 1992 team that snapped the Jaspers' 15-year postseason drought by earning a berth in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT).

As a senior in 1993, Bullock was named the MAAC Player of the Year and MAAC Tournament MVP, as Manhattan won its first MAAC title and reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1958. A three-time First Team All-MAAC selection, Bullock finished his career with 1,992 points, 1,012 rebounds, ranking him second in program history on both lists.

## #The6thBorough

#The6thBorough is the newly formed Official Manhattan Basketball Student Section in Draddy Gymnasium that made its debut at Manhattan Madness in October.

#The6thBorough was a concept developed by Student Government in conjunction with the Student Activities Office and the Athletic Department. #The6thBorough is located in the end zone closest to the visiting bench. Over 2,000 #The6thBorough t-shirts were distributed to students in an effort to organize involvement at basketball games and build a stronger home court advantage.

## Manhattan All-Time Record

In its 107th season, the Manhattan College men's basketball program boasts a 1279-1147 (.527) overall record and 242-270 (.470) MAAC mark in 32 seasons as a conference member. The Jaspers' storied men's basketball team was established in 1904-05 and served a two-year hiatus due to World War II (1943-44 & 1944-45).

## Jaspers at Draddy Gymnasium

Draddy Gymnasium has played host to several Jasper victories and memorable moments since it opened in 1978. Manhattan holds a 246-178 (.579) all-time record at Draddy Gymnasium.

## What's a Jasper?

The unique nickname of Manhattan College's athletic teams, the Jaspers, comes from one of the College's most memorable figures, Brother Jasper of Mary, F.S.C., who served at the College in the late 19th century.

One of the greatest achievements of Brother Jasper was that he brought the then little-known sport of baseball to Manhattan College and became the team's first coach. Since Brother Jasper was also the Prefect of Discipline, he supervised the student fans at Manhattan College baseball games while also directing the team itself.

During one particularly warm and humid day when Manhattan College was playing a semi-pro baseball team called the Metropolitan, Brother Jasper noticed the Manhattan students were becoming restless and edgy as Manhattan came to bat in the seventh inning of a close game. To relieve the tension, Brother Jasper called time-out and told the students to stand up and stretch for a few minutes until the game resumed.

Since the College annually played the New York Giants in the late 1880's and into the 1890's at the old Polo Grounds, the Manhattan College practice of the "seventh inning stretch" spread into the major leagues, where it has now become a time-honored custom practiced by millions of fans annually.

Manhattan College head coach Steve Masiello has quickly restored the winning tradition to the storied men's basketball program in Riverdale, laying the foundation for the Jaspers' return to prominence. Masiello has rejuvenated the Jaspers with strong national recruiting that has transformed Manhattan into a top contender in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference for years to come.

Long-time ESPN college basketball commentator Dick Vitale has even noted, "Remember this name, Steve Masiello. A young, rising coach doing a great job at Manhattan."

Masiello was named Manhattan's 23rd head coach in program history on April 11, 2011. He arrived back in his native New York after spending six years in the Big East as an assistant at Louisville under head coach Rick Pitino.

In his first season at Manhattan, the Jaspers enjoyed the biggest turnaround in the nation, posting 21 victories in 2011-2012, a 15-win improvement from the previous season. It went down as the largest turnaround in program history, and he posted the second most wins by a Manhattan first-year head coach, trailing only Fran Fraschilla's 23 victories in 1992-93.

Masiello garnered Co-Coach of the Year honors by the Metropolitan Writer's Association in 2011-12 as he led Manhattan to its first postseason appearance since 2006. The Jaspers advanced to the Second Round of the CollegeInsider.com Tournament (CIT). Masiello mentored three All-MAAC selections in 2011-2012, including First Team honoree and the league's scoring champion George Beamon.

The Jaspers have also excelled in the classroom under Masiello. Three players earned both MAAC All-Academic distinction and the prestigious Honors Court recognition by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) in 2012. It marked the most student-athlete honorees on both award lists out of the 10 MAAC institutions.

Over his six-year tenure at Louisville, Masiello helped lead the Cards to a 148-61 (.708) overall record, six straight 20-win seasons and four NCAA Tournament appearances. Louisville advanced to the Elite Eight twice (2008 & 2009) during that time. Masiello played a vital role in building Louisville's 2009 Big East Championship team, which won 31 games, including a program record 16 in conference, and entered the NCAA Tournament as the No. 1 overall seed. One of the nation's most renowned recruiters, Masiello effectively directed the Cards' recruiting efforts by signing four Top-20 recruiting classes, which included four McDonald's All-Americans over his time in Louisville. The Cards' 2008 recruiting class garnered a No. 4 national ranking, featuring 2008 USA Today High School National Player of the Year and future NBA player Samardo Samuels.

Masiello was named one of the nation's Top 25 collegiate assistant coaches according to FoxSports.com (2010) & Rivals.com (2007). He managed the Cards' game preparation and scouting responsibilities for his last three years with the program as Louisville amassed a 76-29 (.724) overall record, including a 39-15 (.722) mark in the Big East during this stretch.

Masiello is back in Riverdale for his second coaching tenure at Manhattan. He previously helped lead the Jaspers to three postseason appearances in four years (2001-2005) as an assistant, which included two trips to the NCAA Tournament (2003 & 2004) and one to the NIT (2002). Under his tutelage, the Jaspers posted an 83-36 (.697) overall record and won the 2003 & 2004 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Championships. Masiello was a key contributor on the Jaspers' coaching staff which helped lead Manhattan to its third NCAA Tournament victory in program history in 2004, defeating Florida in the First Round. Prior to Manhattan, Masiello served as the administrative assistant at Tulane under head coach Shawn Finney for one year (2000-01).

A 2000 graduate of the University of Kentucky with a degree in communications, Masiello was a four-year member of the Wildcats' basketball team, playing under head coaches Rick Pitino (1996-97) and Tubby Smith (1997-2000). During his playing career, Kentucky went to the Final Four twice (1997 & 1998), advancing to the National Championship game both times and winning the title in 1998. Masiello was named the Wildcats' co-captain his senior year. Masiello hails from White Plains, N.Y., and attended Archbishop Stepinac High School. He completed his final two years at the Harvey School in Katonah, N.Y., where he helped the basketball program win the New England Prep School Athletic Association Championship. Masiello also served as a ball boy for the New York Knicks during his youth.
