News and Notes

Manhattan is on the road for the second straight contest before returning to Draddy Gymnasium for its home opener on Wednesday against Hofstra. The Jaspers are coming off a 79-51 loss at #2 Louisville where they were without the services of senior guard George Beamon who sat out with an injury. Beamon was the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference's leading scorer in 2011-12 averaging 19.0 points. It was a homecoming for Jaspers' head coach Steve Masiello who spent six years on the Louisville bench under Rick Pitino prior to Manhattan.

Harvard is the first of two Ivy League opponents the Jaspers have on their schedule this season. Manhattan returns a game with Columbia in December, a local rivalry that was renewed last year as the schools are separated by only a few subway stops. This is also the seventh straight year Manhattan will face a team from the Ivy League as Princeton, Penn and Brown have been featured on the schedule in recent seasons.

Head coach Steve Masiello and the Jaspers enjoyed a plethora of success in Masiello's first year at the helm in 2011-2012. Manhattan made the biggest turnaround in the nation with a 15-win improvement from the previous season. The Jaspers went from six wins to 21 and earned a postseason bid for the first time since 2006. Manhattan advanced to the Second Round of the CollegelInsider.com Tournament (CIT).

The Jaspers return 81.2% of their scoring offense from last season. Manhattan placed a league-best four players on the Preseason All-MAAC Teams. Beamon was named to the First Team. Michael Alvarado, Rhamel Brown and Emmy Andujar earned Third Team honors.

2012-2013 Manhattan Men's Basketball Game Notes

Scouting Report Manhattan

Manhattan returned its entire starting line up from the program's 21-win campaign last year under Steve Masiello, who was in his first season at the helm. Jaspers' two-time All-MAAC guard George Beamon, who garnered First Team Sun honors in 2011-2012, missed the season opener at #2 Louisville with an ankle injury. Beamon is the MAAC's reigning scoring champion averaging 19.0 points per game last season.

Rhamel Brown stepped up against the Cardinals in the absence of Beamon going off for a team-high 18 points and career-high 15 rebounds, which marked his eighth career double-double. Brown is the 2011-12 MAAC Defensive Player of the Year. The 6'7", 230-pound forward from Brooklyn is one of the top shot blockers in the country. ESPN.com ranked Brown 7th overall in the category last year after he averaged 2.47 rejections per contest, which led the MAAC.

Junior point guard Michael Alvarado has been a mainstay in the starting line up since his arrival in Riverdale and was tabbed co-captain with Beamon and Brown for the 2012-13 campaign. Alvarado is regarded as one of the premier point guards in the conference. He was a Third Team All-MAAC selection last year who averaged 8.5 points and 3.2 assists. Alvarado is coming off a 13 point effort against the Cardinals on Sunday.

Sophomore RaShawn Stores earned the start against Louisville joining Alvarado, his former high school teammate, in the backcourt for the first time since their careers at All Hallows in the Bronx. Stores scored eight points and grabbed three rebounds over 28 minutes in his collegiate debut.

Sophomore forward Emmy Andujar is expected to make a big impact in 2012-2013 coming off a MAAC All-Rookie campaign. Andujar led Manhattan in assists (105) and rebounding (189) last year, while averaging 8.5 points.

The Jaspers added seven newcomers to the program. Manhattan's 2012-13 roster has been described by Masiello as one of the deepest he has been around as a coach and player.

Harvard

Harvard was picked to finish second in the Ivy League according to the league's preseason poll. The Crimson is coming off a program record 26-win season earning Harvard's second straight Ivy League title in the sixth under head coach Tommy Amaker (93-57 at Harvard). Amaker was named the USBWA District I Coach of the Year in 2011-12.

Junior guard Laurent Rivard is the top returning scorer for the Crimson with 10.1 points per game last season. Rivard knocked down 66 three-pointers and shot 41.0% beyond the arc in 2011-12.

Harvard finished fourth in the nation yielding only 55.6 points per game last year. The Crimson was 25th in NCAA Division I in free-throw shooting (.747).

An underclassmen backcourt featuring sophomore Wesley Saunders (14.5 ppg) and freshman Siyani Chambers (11.5) has anchored Harvard's offensive production through its first two games this season. Saunders is coming off an 18 point effort in a 67-64 buzzer beating loss at UMass on Tuesday as part of the ESPN 24-hour college basketball marathon.

Chambers added 14 points against the Minutemen and senior guard Christian Webster scored 10 points in 31 minutes off the bench. The Crimson knocked down 22 of 26 (84.6%) of its free-throws.

Last Game

#2 Louisville 79, Manhattan 51

Manhattan fell 79-51 at #2 Louisville on Sunday before a crowd of 20,921 at the KFC Yum! Center. Cardinals' guard Russ Smith led all players with 23 points. Jaspers' junior forward Rhamel Brown went off for his eighth career double-double scoring a team-high 18 points and grabbing a game-high 15 rebounds in the setback.

The Jaspers were without the services of senior guard George Beamon who missed the game with an ankle injury. Junior point guard Michael Alvarado helped Brown pick up the work load in the absence of their fellow co-captain. Alvarado finished with 13 points, shooting 9-for-10 at the free-throw line. Sophomore guard RaShawn Stores also chipped in eight points after earning the start in his Manhattan debut.

Louisville had three players score in double-figures, including 10 points apiece from Big East Preseason Player of the Year Peyton Siva and sophomore guard Kevin Ware. Siva also finished with a double-double dishing out 10 assists in the contest.

The Cardinals shot 45.2% (28-62) from the field, while Manhattan posted a 35.7% (15-42) field goal mark. The Jaspers did win the battle of the boards by outrebounding Louisville 37 to 33.

Last Meeting

Manhattan 77, Harvard 66
January 5, 1988
Riverdale, N.Y. - Draddy Gymnasium

Manhattan earned a 77-66 victory over Harvard in their last meeting during the 1987-88 campaign. In the final year of head coach Bob Delle Bovi, the Jaspers used a team-high 23 points from Billy Wheeler to rally past the Crimson for the fourth straight time at Draddy Gymnasium. Peter Runge led Manhattan in rebounding with 10 boards in the contest.

Series History

Manhattan and Harvard meet for the first time in 25 years. Their history consists of competing in eight straight seasons beginning in 1980-81. It was Manhattan's radio analyst Brian Mahoney's third season as the Jaspers head coach.

The series is locked at 4-4 as both teams remain undefeated against the other when playing on their home courts. Harvard won the inaugural match up on Jan. 10, 1981 with Crimson head coach Frank McLaughlin at the helm.

Manhattan's first victory of the series came under head coach Gordon Chiesa on December 22, 1981. The Jaspers earned an 82-77 triumph in Riverdale.

- ▶ Manhattan had the top turnaround in the nation with a 15-win improvement last year (all at NCAA Division I level) coming off a 6-25 overall record in 2010-11
 - ▶ Manhattan's 10 road wins last year tied for the 14th most in the nation
- ▶ The Jaspers return all five starters from 2011-12
 - ▶ Manhattan returns 81.2% of its scoring, 85.8% of rebounds and 77.3% of assists
 - ▶ The Jaspers set a program record in 2011-12 hitting 244 three-pointers, averaging 7.2 per game

Manhattan Top of the Heap in Preseason Polls

After only one season with Steve Masiello at the helm, Manhattan was picked to finish the 2012-13 campaign atop the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC), a position the program was familiar with during his time as an assistant coach (2001-2005). According to Yahoo! Sports and CBSSports.com, the Jaspers are the MAAC's preseason favorite. CBSSports.com also had Manhattan senior guard George Beamon as the projected conference Player of the Year.

Beamon Among Top Returning Scorers in Nation

Manhattan guard George Beamon enters his final season in Riverdale ranked among the top returning scorers in the country. Beamon, the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference's (MAAC) reigning scoring champion, has finished in the top-3 of the league's chart the last two years. The 6'4" native of Roslyn, N.Y. averaged a career-high 19.0 point per game last season, which has landed him 7th place among all returning players in NCAA Division I. Beamon's 2011-2012 scoring average is also the 6th highest among returning seniors for the 2012-2013 campaign.

Beamon has scored 1,131 of his 1,211 career points over 64 appearances in the last two seasons.

The Masiello Project

Manhattan head coach Steve Masiello quickly restored the winning tradition in Riverdale with the greatest turn around in program history last season. The Jaspers' 21-13 overall record is the second best record by a Manhattan first-year head coach post-World War II era. It is only behind Fran Frascilla who finished the 1992-93 campaign 23-7 after inheriting a team coming off a 25-9 season under the direction of head coach Steve Lappas.

2012-2013 Manhattan Men's Basketball Game Notes

Preseason All-MAAC Honors

Manhattan had a league best four players selected to the 2012-13 Preseason All-MAAC Team. Senior guard George Beamon was named to the First Team, while juniors Michael Alvarado, Rhamel Brown and sophomore Emmy Andujar received Third Team honors. These four Jaspers combined for 60% of the team's scoring last season and more than 50% of rebounding and assists for a squad that won 21-games.

Beamon is a two-time All-MAAC selection who was named to the First Team last year after leading the MAAC in scoring with 19.0 points per game. He posted double-figures in the scoring column in all 33 appearances in 2011-12 and led the team in points 26 times. Beamon ranked in the top-25 nationally for scoring average, and he finished in the top-10 of the MAAC for field goal percentage (48.5% - 10th), free-throw shooting (80.1% - 4th), steals (1.5 - 6th), three-point field goal percentage (42.7% - 4th) and three-point field goals (61 - 9th). Over the last two seasons Beamon has scored 1,131 points.

Alvarado, a junior guard, was named to the All-MAAC Third Team in 2011-12. He started 26 of 30 appearances and tied for second on the team in scoring (8.5) and assists per game (3.2), which was also the sixth best average in the MAAC. Alvarado ranked among the leaders in the conference with a 76.6% free-throw percentage.

Brown is a 6'7" forward who earned the MAAC Defensive Player of the Year award last season. Brown led the MAAC with 2.5 blocks per game. He appeared in all 34 games for the Jaspers averaging 7.9 points and 4.9 rebounds in 19.1 minutes per game. He ranked second in the MAAC with a 60.1% field goal percentage.

Andujar was a MAAC All-Rookie Team selection in 2011-12. He started 32 of 33 appearances tying for second on the team in scoring with Alvarado (8.5 ppg). The 6'6" forward dished out a team-high 105 assists and led Manhattan with 189 rebounds.

Block Party

Jaspers' junior forward Rhamel Brown has engraved his name in the Manhattan men's basketball record book. The 6'7" forward set the program's single season blocks record last season with 84 rejections. Brown's 2.47 blocks per game average ranked in the top-20 nationally in 2011-2012, leading the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference in this category for the second straight year.

In 2010-2011, Brown blocked 68 shots, which is the highest total ever by a Jasper freshman, leading the MAAC with 2.2 blocks per game.

Brown is third on the program's career blocks list and on pace to break the Manhattan record held by Steve Grant (220, 1974-78).

Manhattan Second on MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll

Manhattan garnered its highest preseason ranking in seven years on the annual MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Jaspers were selected to finish as the league's runner up in 2012-13 as announced on ESPN3. Manhattan received two first place votes, and was eight points behind preseason favorite Loyola, the defending conference champion.

Jasper Garners Preseason All-America Honors

Manhattan senior guard George Beamon was named to the Preseason Lou Henson All-America Team by CollegeInsider.com. The Lou Henson award is presented annually to the top mid-major player in college basketball. Norfolk State's Kyle O'Quinn received the honor in 2011-12. Beamon, a two-time All-MAAC selection, was joined by Siena's OD Anosike as the only players in the conference to receive the preseason recognition.

Beamon's Tale of the Tape

George Beamon hit only 6 three-pointers in 2010-11, shooting a mere 15% from beyond the arc with his last attempt rattling off the rim that would have sent Manhattan past Siena in overtime at the 2011 MAAC Championships.

In the offseason, Beamon dedicated himself to increase his range and improve his shooting motion. With the advice of the Jaspers' new coaching staff, Beamon wrapped athletic tape around his knuckles when getting up a few hundred shots per day in an effort to improve his form.

The tactic paid dividends last season as Beamon transformed himself into one of the top three-point shooters in the MAAC. He ranked 4th in the conference with a 42.7% three-point shooting mark and he knocked down 61 treys in 2011-12.

Manhattan second-year head coach Steve Masiello reloaded his coaching staff for the 2012-2013 season after former assistants Scott Padgett and Rashon Burno earned elevated coaching positions at other NCAA Division I institutions. During the offseason, Padgett was named associate head coach at Samford University in Birmingham, Ala., and Burno became an assistant coach under two-time national championship head coach Billy Donovan at the University of Florida.

The Jaspers current staff still features Associate Head Coach Matt Grady, who enters his second season in Riverdale. He brings a plethora of high level collegiate experience from his time at Louisville, Cincinnati, Murray State and Morehead State. Grady oversees the primary scouting and game planning responsibilities. "Matt is one of the best basketball minds out there," says Masiello.

Masiello reunited with assistant coach Rasheen Davis who joined the staff in April. Davis came to Riverdale from Xavier where he spent the previous two years as an assistant coach on Chris Mack's staff. Davis helped the Musketeers to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, including a run to the Sweet Sixteen in 2011-12. He joined the Division I coaching ranks in 2007-08 as a program assistant at Louisville under head coach Rick Pitino and Masiello, who was an assistant on the staff.

Oliver Antigua is the third assistant on the Jaspers' staff. He joined the program in June after a successful career at St. Raymond High School in the Bronx, where he coached the Ravens to five Catholic High School Athletic Association (CHSAA) Class AA championships over his 13-year tenure. Antigua's brother Orlando is an assistant coach at Kentucky.

Jaspers in the Hall

Coinciding with the MAAC Championships moving to the MassMutual Center in Springfield, Mass., through 2014, a 600-square foot permanent display dedicated to the conference opened at the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in October 2011. The MAAC Experience includes historical items and artifacts from the MAAC's rich 32-year history. In addition, all 10 MAAC schools have their own display within the exhibit. Manhattan's display features a commemorative No. 23 jersey worn by former Manhattan player, coach and athletic director Jack Powers '58, the former Executive Director of the NIT. Powers was Manhattan's first men's basketball inductee to the MAAC Honor Roll in March at the 2012 MAAC Championships.

The 2013 MAAC Honor Roll Class will feature Manhattan standout Keith Bullock '93 who will be inducted into The MAAC Experience exhibit this March during the MAAC Tournament. The 1990 MAAC Rookie of the Year, Bullock helped lead a renaissance of Manhattan basketball. He was a key starter on the 1992 team that snapped the Jaspers' 15-year postseason drought by earning a berth in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT).

As a senior in 1993, Bullock was named the MAAC Player of the Year and MAAC Tournament MVP, as Manhattan won its first MAAC title and reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1958. A three-time First Team All-MAAC selection, Bullock finished his career with 1,992 points, 1,012 rebounds, ranking him second in program history on both lists.

#The6thBorough

#The6thBorough is the newly formed Official Manhattan Basketball Student Section in Draddy Gymnasium that made its debut at Manhattan Madness in October.

#The6thBorough was a concept developed by Student Government in conjunction with the Student Activities Office and the Athletic Department. #The6thBorough is located in the end zone closest to the visiting bench. Over 2,000 #The6thBorough t-shirts were distributed to students in an effort to organize involvement at basketball games and build a stronger home court advantage.

Manhattan All-Time Record

In its 107th season, the Manhattan College men's basketball program boasts a 1269-1131 (.529) overall record and 234-261 (.474) MAAC mark in 32 seasons as a conference member. The Jaspers storied men's basketball team was established in 1904-05 and served a two-year hiatus due to World War II (1943-44 & 1944-45).

Jaspers at Draddy Gymnasium

Draddy Gymnasium played host to several Jasper victories and memorable moments since it opened in 1978. Manhattan holds a 240-174 (.579) all-time record at Draddy Gymnasium.

What's a Jasper?

The unique nickname of Manhattan College's athletic teams, the Jaspers, comes from one of the College's most memorable figures, Brother Jasper of Mary, F.S.C., who served at the College in the late 19th century.

One of the greatest achievements of Brother Jasper was that he brought the then little-known sport of baseball to Manhattan College and became the team's first coach. Since Brother Jasper was also the Prefect of Discipline, he supervised the student fans at Manhattan College baseball games while also directing the team itself.

During one particularly warm and humid day when Manhattan College was playing a semi-pro baseball team called the Metropolitan, Brother Jasper noticed the Manhattan students were becoming restless and edgy as Manhattan came to bat in the seventh inning of a close game. To relieve the tension, Brother Jasper called time-out and told the students to stand up and stretch for a few minutes until the game resumed.

Since the College annually played the New York Giants in the late 1880's and into the 1890's at the old Polo Grounds, the Manhattan College practice of the "seventh inning stretch" spread into the major leagues, where it has now become a time-honored custom practiced by millions of fans annually.

Head Coach Steve Masiello Second Season (21-14)

Manhattan College head coach Steve Masiello has quickly restored the winning tradition to the storied men's basketball program in Riverdale, laying the foundation for the Jaspers' return to prominence. Masiello has rejuvenated the Jaspers with strong national recruiting that has transformed Manhattan into a top contender in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference for years to come.

Long-time ESPN college basketball commentator Dick Vitale has even noted, "Remember this name, Steve Masiello. A young, rising coach doing a great job at Manhattan."

Masiello was named Manhattan's 23rd head coach in program history on April 11, 2011. He arrived back in his native New York after spending six years in the Big East as an assistant at Louisville under head coach Rick Pitino.

In his first season at Manhattan, the Jaspers enjoyed the biggest turnaround in the nation, posting 21 victories in 2011-2012, a 15-win improvement from the previous season. It went down as the largest turnaround in program history, and he posted the second most wins by a Manhattan first-year head coach, trailing only Fran Fraschilla's 23 victories in 1992-93.

Masiello garnered Co-Coach of the Year honors by the Metropolitan Writer's Association in 2011-12 as he led Manhattan to its first postseason appearance since 2006. The Jaspers advanced to the Second Round of the CollegeInsider.com Tournament (CIT). Masiello mentored three All-MAAC selections in 2011-2012, including First Team honoree and the league's scoring champion George Beamon.

The Jaspers have also excelled in the classroom under Masiello. Three players earned both MAAC All-Academic distinction and the prestigious Honors Court recognition by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) in 2012. It marked the most student-athlete honorees on both award lists out of the 10 MAAC institutions.

Over his six-year tenure at Louisville, Masiello helped lead the Cards to a 148-61 (.708) overall record, six straight 20-win seasons and four NCAA Tournament appearances. Louisville advanced to the Elite Eight twice (2008 & 2009) during that time. Masiello played a vital role in building Louisville's 2009 Big East Championship team, which won 31 games, including a program record 16 in conference, and entered the NCAA Tournament as the No. 1 overall seed. One of the nation's most renowned recruiters, Masiello effectively directed the Cards' recruiting efforts by signing four Top-20 recruiting classes, which included four McDonald's All-Americans over his time in Louisville. The Cards' 2008 recruiting class garnered a No. 4 national ranking, featuring 2008 USA Today High School National Player of the Year and future NBA player Samardo Samuels.

Masiello was named one of the nation's Top 25 collegiate assistant coaches according to FoxSports.com (2010) & Rivals.com (2007). He managed the Cards' game preparation and scouting responsibilities for his last three years with the program as Louisville amassed a 76-29 (.724) overall record, including a 39-15 (.722) mark in the Big East during this stretch.

Masiello is back in Riverdale for his second coaching tenure at Manhattan. He previously helped lead the Jaspers to three postseason appearances in four years (2001-2005) as an assistant, which included two trips to the NCAA Tournament (2003 & 2004) and one to the NIT (2002). Under his tutelage, the Jaspers posted an 83-36 (.697) overall record and won the 2003 & 2004 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Championships. Masiello was a key contributor on the Jaspers' coaching staff which helped lead Manhattan to its third NCAA Tournament victory in program history in 2004, defeating Florida in the First Round. Prior to Manhattan, Masiello served as the administrative assistant at Tulane under head coach Shawn Finney for one year (2000-01).

A 2000 graduate of the University of Kentucky with a degree in communications, Masiello was a four-year member of the Wildcats' basketball team, playing under head coaches Rick Pitino (1996-97) and Tubby Smith (1997-2000). During his playing career, Kentucky went to the Final Four twice (1997 & 1998), advancing to the National Championship game both times and winning the title in 1998. Masiello was named the Wildcats' co-captain his senior year. Masiello hails from White Plains, N.Y., and attended Archbishop Stepinac High School. He completed his final two years at the Harvey School in Katonah, N.Y., where he helped the basketball program win the New England Prep School Athletic Association Championship. Masiello also served as a ball boy for the New York Knicks during his youth.
