News and Notes

Manhattan locked up the #6 seed for the 2013 MAAC Championships after getting hot down the stretch winning seven of its final 10 contests of the regular-season. The Jaspers' key victory came on March 1 when they edged Fairfield 34-31 to sweep the regular-season series with the Stags. Manhattan and Fairfield both finished 9-9, but the Jaspers had the tie breaker advantage based on their head-to-head record. Additionally, the 65 combined points between Manhattan and Fairfield shattered a MAAC record for fewest in a game that was set on Feb. 23, 1982 (Saint Peter's 44, Manhattan 36), which was also played at Draddy Gymnasium. It also marked the second fewest points in NCAA Division I since the three-point arc was instituted in 1986.

Jaspers' junior forward Rhamel Brown was named to the All-MAAC Second Team after a memorable campaign. He led Manhattan in scoring during the regular-season (11.7 ppg). Brown ranked 10th nationally with 3.03 blocks per game, he led the MAAC in field goal percentage (55.6%) and was fifth with 7.1 rebounds per game.

First year players Shane Richards and RaShawn Stores were named to the MAAC All-Rookie Team. Richards averaged 9.2 points and 2.7 rebounds in MAAC contests. Stores was named MAAC Rookie of the Week three times as he finished the regular-season with 5.7 points and he dished out 67 assists.

Manhattan will meet Loyola for the fourth time in MAAC Tournament history. The Jaspers own a 3-1 record against the Greyhounds in the MAAC Tournament, which includes a 94-79 victory in the 2010 First Round at the Times Union Center in Albany, N.Y. With a victory, Manhattan will play the winner of #2 Rider vs. #7 Fairfield or #10 Saint Peter's in the semifinals.

Manhattan and Loyola meet for just the fifth time in MAAC Tournament history. The Jaspers are 3-1 all-time versus the Greyhounds in the postseason, winning their last two meetings. Manhattan's only loss to the Greyhounds came in the 1994 Championship Game. Loyola first year head coach, the late Skip Prosser guided the Greyhounds to an 80-75 victory. Former Manhattan head coach Fran Fraschilla, the winningest head coach in program history (86-34, .716) and 2012 Manhattan Athletic Hall of Fame inductee, was in his second year at the helm.

The Jaspers rolled past the Greyhounds in their last MAAC Tournament meeting, 94-79, on March 5, 2010 at the Times Union Center in Albany, N.Y. Rico Pickett scored a career-high 33 points and Darryl Crawford delivered a double-double (16 points, 10 rebounds) to send Manhattan into the Quarterfinals.

MAAC Tournament History

Manhattan is one of the six founding members of the MAAC which was established in 1980. Since the inaugural season of competition in 1981-82, the Jaspers are 19-28 in the MAAC Tournament. Manhattan has won three MAAC Championships (1993, 2003, 2004). Two of the Jaspers' three MAAC titles (1993 & 2004) were won in Albany, N.Y., including their last championship. Manhattan (1995) and Iona (2012) are the only schools in MAAC history to earn an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament.

MAAC Tournament History

Manhattan enters the 2013 MAAC Championships as the #6 seed for the third time in program history. The last time the Jaspers were the #6 seed was at the 2005 MAAC Tournament in Buffalo, N.Y. There has never been a MAAC Champion who entered the Tournament as the #6 seed.

The Jaspers are 19-18 in the MAAC Tournament since the program earned its first victory in 1992. Manhattan has made eight semifinal appearances and six trips to the championship game.

MAAC Titles

Manhattan won back-to-back titles in 2003 & 2004 under the direction of former head coach Bobby Gonzalez and current Jaspers' head coach Steve Masiello who was an assistant on the staff. Jaspers' all-time leading scorer Luis Flores '04 (2,046 pts, 89 games) was named the Most Valuable Player both years averaging 26.0 points en route to the 2003 title and 23.0 points per game in the 2004 championship run. Manhattan won its first MAAC Championship in 1993 as Tournament MVP Keith Bullock '93 led the Jaspers to a 68-67 victory over Niagara at the Times Union Center in Albany (formerly known as the Knickerbocker Arena). The memorable run was in the first of four seasons under head coach Fran Fraschilla.

Masiello in the Postseason

Manhattan second year head coach Steve Masiello has enjoyed a plethora of success in the postseason both as a coach and player. During his six year assistant coaching tenure at Louisville under Rick Pitino, Masiello helped lead the Cards to four NCAA Tournament appearances, advancing to the Elite Eight twice (2008 & 2009). Louisville posted a 5-2 record in the Big East Tournament in his final three seasons on staff, while going to the Championship game two of the three years, and winning the Big East Tournament title in 2009.

Masiello helped guide Manhattan to two MAAC Championships (2003 & 2004) during his time as an assistant in Riverdale from 2001-02 to 2004-05. The Jaspers posted a 5-2 MAAC Tournament record during this stretch.

As a player at Kentucky from 1996-2000, Masiello was a part of three SEC Championships, two trips to the National Championship game (1997 & 1998), and winning the title in 1998.

Manhattan in the MAAC Quarterfinals

The quarterfinals has been the toughest round for the Jaspers over the years. Manhattan is 5-18 all-time in the MAAC Tournament Quarterfinals. The Jaspers have not won a game in this round since 1998 when they earned a 71-58 victory over Rider at the Times Union Center (formerly named the Pepsi Arena) in Albany, N.Y. Manhattan has dropped its last nine quarterfinal contests all against Siena (2001, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2012) and Fairfield (2000, 2002, 2005, 2009).

Scouting Report Manhattan

The Jaspers enter the 2013 MAAC Tournament as one of the hottest teams in the conference going 7-3 in the last 10 games of the regular-season. Manhattan held a season-best four game win streak from Feb. 3 - 15, which included a 22-point victory at Fairfield and a thrilling double-overtime triumph against Iona.

Junior forward Rhamel Brown enjoyed a breakout campaign, earning All-MAAC Second Team honors. The 6'7" co-captain from Brooklyn stepped up for the Jaspers with the absence of senior guard George Beamon who suffered a season ending injury. Beamon was the MAAC's scoring champion in 2011-12, averaging 19.0 points per game, and entered the year as the seventh top returning scorer in the nation.

Brown led Manhattan, averaging 11.7 points and ranked fifth in the MAAC with 7.1 rebounds per game. For the third straight year, Brown led the MAAC in blocked shots (88), ranking 10th nationally with 3.03 per game. Brown also led the league with a 55.6% field goal shooting mark. One of the most unique players in conference history, Brown teased triple-doubles on several occasions. He had five double-doubles and had four career-high seven block performances.

Junior co-captain Michael Alvarado and sophomore Emmy Andujar were also factors in the Jaspers' success in the last five weeks of the season. Alvarado, a 6'2" point guard from the Bronx, returned to the starting line up on Jan. 27, coming back from an ankle injury he suffered on Jan. 1 against Stony Brook. Alvarado started the final 10 games of the regular-season as he helped Manhattan post a 4-1 home record during this span. Alvarado was the second leading scorer in the Jaspers' spread offense with 8.2 points per game.

Andujar, a 6'6" 205-pound point forward from the Bronx, led Manhattan in assists for the second straight year with 72, going along with a 7.8 scoring average.

Sophomore forward Donovan Kates has emerged as a key threat for the Jaspers. Kates has scored in double-figures in six of the last seven MAAC games. He is averaging 11.1 points and shooting 90.6% (29-32) at the free-throw line during this stretch.

Manhattan placed two first-year players on the MAAC Rookie Team in Shane Richards and RaShawn Stores. Richards averaged 9.2 points appearing in all 18 MAAC contests. He finished the regular-season fifth in the league shooting 39.6% beyond the arc and sixth averaging 2.0 threes per contest.

Stores was named MAAC Rookie of the Week three times. He averaged 5.7 points and dished out 67 assists, playing in all 29 games.

Manhattan has been the top defensive team in conference action. The Jaspers lead the MAAC yielding only 57.6 points per game and a 38.1% field goal shooting defense.

Loyola

The Greyhounds won four of the last five games of the regular-season, including a 63-61 win over Manhattan on March 3 in Baltimore. Erik Etherly led the charge against the Jaspers with a career-high 30 points.

Junior guard Dylan Cormier is the Greyhounds' leading scorer with 16.6 points per game. Cormier is the fifth leading scorer in the MAAC. The Baltimore native has handed out a team-high 74 assists this season.

Etherly, a 6'7" 225-pound graduate student, has posted 16.2 points per game. He is tied with Anthony Winbush averaging 6.3 rebounds.

Senior guard Robert Olson is the third Greyhound averaging double-figures with a 12.9 scoring average. He is the only Loyola player to start all 31 games this season. Olson has knocked down a team-high 64 three-pointers, which are the fifth most in the MAAC.

Loyola is one of the better defensive teams in the league yielding 63.7 points per game. The Greyhounds lead the MAAC with 4.5 blocks per contest and rank second with 7.3 steals.

Last Game

Manhattan was edged in the regular-season finale Sunday at Loyola falling 63-61. Greyhounds' forward Erik Etherly set a career-high with 30 points as Manhattan had its two-game win streak snapped. The Jaspers were led in scoring by junior forward Rhamel Brown, who finished with 14 points and eight rebounds, marking his 18th double-digit performance of the season.

Etherly scored 19 of his 30 points by half-time as the Greyhounds carried a 39-35 advantage into the locker room. Etherly scored seven of nine straight points by Loyola in the last five minutes to capture a lead it did not relinquish.

The Jaspers led for the majority of the first half with Donovan Kates posting nine of his 11 points in the opening stanza. Kates shot a perfect 7--for-7 at the free-throw line and matched Brown's eight rebounds.

Manhattan rallied back from a 13 point deficit in the second half. Sophomore forward Emmy Andujar made it a three-point game with a layup with 3:55 remaining, but the Jaspers could not get any closer. Senior guard Mohamed Koita buried key three-pointers to power the spurt. Andujar and Koita each posted 10 points.

The Jaspers rallied behind Rico Pickett's career-high 33 points to knock Loyola out of the 2010 MAAC Tournament with a 94-79 victory. Darryl Crawford added 16 points and 10 rebounds to send Manhattan into the Quarterfinals.

Manhattan had its highest scoring half of the season opening a 51-36 advantage by intermission. Pickett had 23 points in the first 20 minutes, shooting 8-for-12 in the period. Manhattan scored 14 unanswered points to rush out to a 14-2 advantage less than five minutes into the ballgame. Manhattan never looked back. The Jaspers opened a 19 point lead in the first half.

The Jaspers received 14 points and five rebounds from Brandon Adams. George Beamon added 13 points and seven rebounds in 12 minutes off the Manhattan bench.

Shane Walker led Loyola with 26 points and eight boards. The Greyhounds received 13 points and seven rebounds from Jamal Barney, and Brett Harvey posted 10 points.

Series History

Manhattan and Loyola meet for the 56th time in series history. The Jaspers own a 31-24 record all-time against the Greyhounds, but Loyola has an active six-game win streak against the Jaspers. The Greyhounds have also won 12 of their last 15 meetings.

The Jaspers' last victory over Loyola was in the 2010 MAAC Tournament First Round when Manhattan defeated the Greyhounds 94-79 on March 5 at the Times Union Center in Albany, N.Y. Jaspers' guard Rico Pickett led the way with 33 points and Darryl Crawford delivered a double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds. Manhattan converted 38-of-46 free-throw attempts.

Manhattan is 3-1 in the MAAC Tournament against Loyola. The Jaspers have eliminated the Greyhounds in their last two postseason meetings (2005, 2010). In 2005, the sixth seeded Jaspers upended ninth-seeded Loyola 88-67 in Buffalo. Four Jaspers scored in double-figures as Jeff Xavier led the way posting 20 points with four three-pointers. Jason Wingate (19), Peter Mulligan (16) and Arturo Dubois (13) also registered double-digits in a 53.4% shooting performance.

Three Jaspers Named to All-MAAC Teams

Junior forward Rhamel Brown was named to the All-MAAC Second Team, while first-year players Shane Richards and RaShawn Stores made the league's All-Rookie Team. Brown led Manhattan in scoring averaging 11.7 points per game. He led the MAAC in blocks with 3.03 per contest, ranking 10th nationally in the category. Brown was arguably the elite big man in the league on both ends of the court as he led the MAAC shooting 55.6% and was fifth with 7.1 rebounds.

Richards averaged 9.2 points playing in all 18 MAAC games. He delivered 11 double-digit scoring performances and led the team in scoring 7 times. Richards finished the regular-season fifth shooting 39.6% from downtown and sixth with 2.0 threes per game.

Stores was named MAAC Rookie of the Week three times. He averaged 5.9 points and dished out 67 assists. He had six double-digit scoring efforts and finished the regular-season leading the team in assists 10 times.

2012 MAAC Quarterfinals

Manhattan had its memorable 2011-2012 campaign come to an end prematurely in the MAAC Tournament Quarterfinals, falling in overtime to Siena 84-82 at the MassMutual Center. The third-seeded Jaspers had a chance to advance to the Semifinals for the first time 2006, but senior guard Kidani Brutus' potential game winning shot revolved around the rim twice before falling off the mark at the end of regulation. Owen Wignot's free-throw with 19 seconds remaining in OT capped a 22 point effort and sealed the victory for Siena.

A February to Remember

Manhattan went 5-2 in February capping the month with a road victory at Buffalo, edging the Bulls 65-64 on Feb. 23. The Jaspers played their best basketball in February, delivering some of their top performances of the season in wins over Canisius (Feb. 7), Fairfield (Feb. 12) and Iona (Feb. 15). Manhattan averaged a 12.0-point margin of victory in those three wins.

The Jaspers ran away with a wire-to-wire victory over Canisius at Draddy Gymnasium and opened a season-high 27 point lead in the second half. Manhattan shot a season best 54.8% from the field against the Golden Griffins in a balance scoring attack that featured four Jaspers scoring in double-figures, including a team-high 14 points from sophomore forward Donovan Kates.

Manhattan put its top defensive performance on display in its largest margin of victory of the year at Fairfield (62-40) on Feb. 12. The Jaspers held the Stags to the fewest points they allowed this season, along with keeping Fairfield to a season-low 25.4% field goal percentage defense.

The Jaspers' double overtime victory against Iona goes down as one of the most memorable games in Draddy Gymnasium history. Manhattan junior forward Rhamel Brown had arguably the top individual all-around performance by a MAAC player this season as he went for 21 points, a career-high 17 rebounds and blocked a career-high 7 shots. It was his 10th offensive rebound of the ballgame off a missed free-throw with 11 seconds remaining that set the stage for Emmy Andujar's game-winning layup (74-73).

Manhattan Rallies Behind Veteran Floor General

Junior co-captain Michael Alvarado has been a key contributor to the Jaspers success as of late since his return to the starting lineup on Jan. 27 in a 62-51 road victory at Rider. Alvarado worked his way back from an ankle injury he suffered on Jan. 1 against Stony Brook that sidelined the point guard from the Bronx for three games. Manhattan has posted a 7-3 record in the last 10 games of the regular-season since he rejoined the starting lineup. Since his return as a starter, Alvarado has four double-digit scoring performances. Alvarado has converted 82.2% (37-45) of his free-throw attempts.

Jaspers Peaking; Momentum Building for March Madness

Manhattan transformed into one of the hottest teams in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference, after winning 7 of its last 10 games of the regular-season. The Jaspers went on a season best four game winning streak from Feb. 3 - 15, which included back-to-back double-digit victories over Canisius (Feb. 7) and Fairfield (Feb. 12). Manhattan has averaged an 9.7-point margin of victory in the last six MAAC wins.

Defensive Intensity

Manhattan has been the top defensive team in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) this season. The Jaspers lead the league lead, yielding only 57.6 points per game against conference opponents. Manhattan has the best field goal defense (38.1%) versus the MAAC.

The Jaspers' active defense revolves around the MAAC's reigning Defensive Player of the Year Rhamel Brown, who leads the league for the third straight year in blocked shots (3.03). Brown is averaging 3.7 blocks in the Jaspers' 18 conference games, which includes four career-high 7 block performances and one 6 block effort.

Winning 5 of the last 7 MAAC games, the Jaspers have limited opponents to 52.9 points and a 35.0% field goal mark and 30.1% three-point field goal shooting percentage.

Blocks King

Jaspers' junior forward Rhamel Brown engraved his name in the Manhattan men's basketball record book on Feb. 12, 2013 at Fairfield when he became the program's career blocks leader. Brown surpassed Steve Grant (220, 1974-78) who held the record for 35 years.

The 6'7" forward also surpassed his own single season blocks record on March 1 against Fairfield. Brown has 88 blocks this season and is still climbing.

Brown blocked 84 shots in 2011-12. Brown's 2.47 blocks per game average ranked in the top-20 nationally in 2011-2012, leading the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference in this category.

In 2010-2011, Brown blocked 68 shots, which is the highest total ever by a Jasper freshman, leading the MAAC with 2.2 blocks per game.

Brown is still climbing the MAAC's career and single season blocks list in only three seasons at Manhattan.

Jaspers Challenged with Non-League Slate

Manhattan played arguably the most difficult non-conference schedule in the MAAC this season. Coming off a 21-win campaign, returning all five starters and 81.2% of the scoring offense, Manhattan compiled an aggressive non-league slate that featured five teams that advanced to the 2012 postseason and won 20+ games last year (Louisville, Harvard, Dayton, LIU Brooklyn, Stony Brook). The Jaspers did not account for the 2011-12 MAAC scoring champion George Beamon to go down with an ankle injury two days before the opener at Louisville. Despite the setback, Manhattan has fared well, as the team is finding its identity with a roster that features Preseason All-MAAC selections Rhamel Brown, Michael Alvarado and Emmy Andujar. The Jaspers are playing at a higher level since entering the MAAC schedule.

Jaspers Named MAAC Rookies of the Week

First-year guard RaShawn Stores and freshman Shane Richards have each been named the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Rookie of the Week this season.

Stores earned his first of three awards on Dec. 10 after the 5'11" point guard from the Bronx averaged 10.5 points shooting 61.5% (8-13) from the field in two games. He also added nine assists without having a turnover and buried 71.4% (5-7) of his three-point field goal attempts. Stores had his top performance of the week against Siena (Dec. 9) as he helped the Jaspers earn a 75-55 triumph. He set career highs with 12 points and six assists, while shooting a perfect 4-for-4 from three-point territory. Stores also grabbed five rebounds and swiped two steals in 24 minutes off the bench.

Stores earned his second and third MAAC Rookie of the Week Awards in consecutive weeks. On Feb. 4, he garnered the accolade after delivering a 10-point performance to propel Manhattan to a 57-49 win over Saint Peter's on Feb. 3. Then on Feb. 11, Stores received the award after scoring 13 points in a 67-54 victory over Canisius at Draddy Gymnasium.

Richards was selected MAAC Rookie of the Week on Jan. 14. He averaged 14.5 points and buried eight three-pointers in two appearances against Rider (Jan. 10) and Marist (Jan. 13). The 6'5" New York City native exploded for a team-high 18 points before a national audience on ESPN3 versus Rider. He delivered another double-digit scoring performance, finishing with 11 points to help lead Manhattan to a 65-53 victory over Marist.

Manhattan Inks Three to NLI's

Manhattan signed three highly-touted student-athletes during the NCAA Early Signing Period. Former five-star recruit and elite junior college prospect Chris Thomas (Denver, Colo./Chipola College), along with incoming freshmen, 6'10" center Carlton Allen (Ewing, N.J./Life Center Academy) and 6'0" guard Tyler Wilson (Bronx, N.Y./Cardinal Hayes) signed their National Letters of Intent to play for the Jaspers in 2013-14.

Thomas is 6'5" shooting guard from Colorado who is regarded as one of the purest scorers in the nation with high-major talent. He will come to Manhattan after one season playing at Chipola College for head coach Patrick Blake in Marianna, Fla. Chipola was the preseason fourth-ranked team in the country on the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) poll. Thomas was ranked as the #1 shooting guard and fifth overall prospect by Rivals.com and was an ESPN Super 60 recruit.

Allen comes to Manhattan from Life Center Academy in Burlington, N.J., where he plays for head coach Pervis Ellison, an 11-year NBA veteran. Allen is a 6'10", 240-pound student-athlete who provides a low post scoring threat for the Jaspers. He maneuvers well in the deep post and has a repertoire of inside moves, including the jump hook, according to ESPN.com. ESPN.com also ranks Allen as the 41st player at his position in 2013 class.

Wilson is a speedy guard who handles the ball well and is a legitimate scoring threat. He helped lead Cardinal Hayes to the Catholic High School Athletic Association (CHSAA) Class AA intersectional semifinals as a junior. He averaged approximately 12 points and seven assists per game last year, after playing two years at Rice High School.

MAAC Player of the Week Honors

Manhattan senior guard George Beamon was named MAAC Player of the Week on Nov. 26 after averaging 24.0 points and 5.5 rebounds in the two contests against Hofstra and Dayton. Beamon shot 64% (16-25) from the field and 81.3% (13-16) at the free-throw line, making a seamless transition back into the starting lineup after missing the Jaspers' first two contests with an injury.

Beamon exploded for 29 points and grabbed seven rebounds to lead Manhattan to a 67-56 victory over Hofstra. He shot 10-for-15 (66.7%) from the field and it was his 19th career 20+point performance.

The Roslyn, N.Y., native continued his superb play at Dayton as he delivered his 50th straight double-figure scoring effort. Beamon finished with 19 points, four rebounds, three assists and three steals. He was 6-for-10 (60%) from the field and 6-for-6 at the free-throw line.

Beamon Among Top Returning Scorers in Nation

Manhattan guard George Beamon entered his final season in Riverdale ranked among the top returning scorers in the country. Beamon, the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference's (MAAC) reigning scoring champion, has finished in the top-3 of the league's chart the last two years. The 6'4" native of Roslyn, N.Y., averaged a career-high 19.0 points per game last season, which has landed him 7th place among all returning players in NCAA Division I. Beamon's 2011-2012 scoring average is also the 6th highest among returning seniors for the 2012-2013 campaign.

Manhattan Top of the Heap in Media Polls

After only one season with Steve Masiello at the helm, Manhattan was picked to finish the 2012-13 campaign atop the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC), a position the program was familiar with during his time as an assistant coach (2001-2005). According to Yahoo! Sports and CBSSports.com, the Jaspers are the MAAC's preseason favorite. CBSSports.com also had Manhattan senior guard George Beamon as the projected conference Player of the Year.

Manhattan Second on MAAC Preseason Poll

Manhattan garnered its highest preseason ranking in seven years on the annual MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Jaspers were selected to finish as the league's runner up in 2012-13 as announced on ESPN3. Manhattan received two first place votes, and was eight points behind preseason favorite Loyola, the defending conference champion.

Preseason All-MAAC Honors

Manhattan had a league-best four players selected to the 2012-13 Preseason All-MAAC Team. Senior guard George Beamon was named to the First Team, while juniors Michael Alvarado, Rhamel Brown and sophomore Emmy Andujar received Third Team honors. These four Jaspers combined for 60% of the team's scoring last season and more than 50% of rebounding and assists for a squad that won 21-games.

Beamon is a two-time All-MAAC selection who was named to the First Team last year after leading the MAAC in scoring with 19.0 points per game. He posted double-figures in the scoring column in all 33 appearances in 2011-12 and led the team in points 26 times. Beamon ranked in the top-25 nationally for scoring average, and he finished in the top-10 of the MAAC for field goal percentage (48.5% - 10th), free-throw shooting (80.1% - 4th), steals (1.5 - 6th), three-point field goal percentage (42.7% - 4th) and three-point field goals (61 - 9th). Beamon scored 1,131 points in the previous two seasons.

Alvarado, a junior guard, was named to the All-MAAC Third Team in 2011-12. He started 26 of 30 appearances and tied for second on the team in scoring (8.5) and assists per game (3.2), which was also the sixth best average in the MAAC. Alvarado ranked among the leaders in the conference with a 76.6% free-throw percentage.

Brown is a 6'7" forward who earned the MAAC Defensive Player of the Year award last season. Brown led the MAAC with 2.5 blocks per game. He appeared in all 34 games for the Jaspers averaging 7.9 points and 4.9 rebounds in 19.1 minutes per game. He ranked second in the MAAC with a 60.1% field goal percentage.

Andujar was a MAAC All-Rookie Team selection in 2011-12. He started 32 of 33 appearances tying for second on the team in scoring with Alvarado (8.5 ppg). The 6'6" forward dished out a team-high 105 assists and led Manhattan with 189 rebounds.

Manhattan Staff

Manhattan second-year head coach Steve Masiello reloaded his coaching staff for the 2012-2013 season after former assistants Scott Padgett and Rashon Burno earned elevated coaching positions at other NCAA Division I institutions. During the offseason, Padgett was named associate head coach at Samford University in Birmingham, Ala., and Burno became an assistant coach under two-time national championship head coach Billy Donovan at the University of Florida.

The Jaspers current staff still features Associate Head Coach Matt Grady, who enters his second season in Riverdale. He brings a plethora of high level collegiate experience from his time at Louisville, Cincinnati, Murray State and Morehead State. Grady oversees the primary scouting and game planning responsibilities. "Matt is one of the best basketball minds out there," says Masiello.

Masiello reunited with assistant coach Rasheen Davis, who joined the staff in April. Davis came to Riverdale from Xavier, where he spent the previous two years as an assistant coach on Chris Mack's staff. Davis helped the Musketeers to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, including a run to the Sweet Sixteen in 2011-12. He joined the Division I coaching ranks in 2007-08 as a program assistant at Louisville under head coach Rick Pitino and Masiello, who was an assistant on the staff.

Oliver Antigua is the third assistant on the Jaspers' staff. He joined the program in June after a successful career at St. Raymond High School in the Bronx, where he coached the Ravens to five Catholic High School Athletic Association (CHSAA) Class AA championships over his 13-year tenure. Antigua's brother Orlando is an assistant coach at Kentucky.

Jaspers in the Hall

Coinciding with the MAAC Championships moving to the MassMutual Center in Springfield, Mass., through 2014, a 600-square foot permanent display dedicated to the conference opened at the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in October 2011. The MAAC Experience includes historical items and artifacts from the MAAC's rich 32-year history. In addition, all 10 MAAC schools have their own display within the exhibit. Manhattan's display features a commemorative No. 23 jersey worn by former Manhattan player, coach and athletic director Jack Powers '58, the former Executive Director of the NIT. Powers was Manhattan's first men's basketball inductee to the MAAC Honor Roll in March at the 2012 MAAC Championships.

The 2013 MAAC Honor Roll Class will feature Manhattan standout Keith Bullock '93 who will be inducted into The MAAC Experience exhibit this March during the MAAC Tournament. The 1990 MAAC Rookie of the Year, Bullock helped lead a renaissance of Manhattan basketball. He was a key starter on the 1992 team that snapped the Jaspers' 15-year postseason drought by earning a berth in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT).

As a senior in 1993, Bullock was named the MAAC Player of the Year and MAAC Tournament MVP, as Manhattan won its first MAAC title and reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1958. A three-time First Team All-MAAC selection, Bullock finished his career with 1,992 points, 1,012 rebounds, ranking him second in program history on both lists.

#The6thBorough

#The6thBorough is the newly formed Official Manhattan Basketball Student Section in Draddy Gymnasium that made its debut at Manhattan Madness in October.

#The6thBorough was a concept developed by Student Government in conjunction with the Student Activities Office and the Athletic Department. #The6thBorough is located in the end zone closest to the visiting bench. Over 2,000 #The6thBorough t-shirts were distributed to students in an effort to organize involvement at basketball games and build a stronger home court advantage.

Manhattan All-Time Record

In its 107th season, the Manhattan College men's basketball program boasts a 1280-1148 (.527) overall record and 243-271 (.473) MAAC mark in 32 seasons as a conference member. The Jaspers' storied men's basketball team was established in 1904-05 and served a two-year hiatus due to World War II (1943-44 & 1944-45).

Jaspers at Draddy Gymnasium

Draddy Gymnasium has played host to several Jasper victories and memorable moments since it opened in 1978. Manhattan holds a 247-178 (.579) all-time record at Draddy Gymnasium.

What's a Jasper?

The unique nickname of Manhattan College's athletic teams, the Jaspers, comes from one of the College's most memorable figures, Brother Jasper of Mary, F.S.C., who served at the College in the late 19th century.

One of the greatest achievements of Brother Jasper was that he brought the then little-known sport of baseball to Manhattan College and became the team's first coach. Since Brother Jasper was also the Prefect of Discipline, he supervised the student fans at Manhattan College baseball games while also directing the team itself.

During one particularly warm and humid day when Manhattan College was playing a semi-pro baseball team called the Metropolitan, Brother Jasper noticed the Manhattan students were becoming restless and edgy as Manhattan came to bat in the seventh inning of a close game. To relieve the tension, Brother Jasper called time-out and told the students to stand up and stretch for a few minutes until the game resumed.

Since the College annually played the New York Giants in the late 1880's and into the 1890's at the old Polo Grounds, the Manhattan College practice of the "seventh inning stretch" spread into the major leagues, where it has now become a time-honored custom practiced by millions of fans annually.

Head Coach Steve Masiello Second Season (33-30)

Manhattan College head coach Steve Masiello has quickly restored the winning tradition to the storied men's basketball program in Riverdale, laying the foundation for the Jaspers' return to prominence. Masiello has rejuvenated the Jaspers with strong national recruiting that has transformed Manhattan into a top contender in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference for years to come.

Long-time ESPN college basketball commentator Dick Vitale has even noted, "Remember this name, Steve Masiello. A young, rising coach doing a great job at Manhattan."

Masiello was named Manhattan's 23rd head coach in program history on April 11, 2011. He arrived back in his native New York after spending six years in the Big East as an assistant at Louisville under head coach Rick Pitino.

In his first season at Manhattan, the Jaspers enjoyed the biggest turnaround in the nation, posting 21 victories in 2011-2012, a 15-win improvement from the previous season. It went down as the largest turnaround in program history, and he posted the second most wins by a Manhattan first-year head coach, trailing only Fran Fraschilla's 23 victories in 1992-93.

Masiello garnered Co-Coach of the Year honors by the Metropolitan Writer's Association in 2011-12 as he led Manhattan to its first postseason appearance since 2006. The Jaspers advanced to the Second Round of the CollegeInsider.com Tournament (CIT). Masiello mentored three All-MAAC selections in 2011-2012, including First Team honoree and the league's scoring champion George Beamon.

The Jaspers have also excelled in the classroom under Masiello. Three players earned both MAAC All-Academic distinction and the prestigious Honors Court recognition by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) in 2012. It marked the most student-athlete honorees on both award lists out of the 10 MAAC institutions.

Over his six-year tenure at Louisville, Masiello helped lead the Cards to a 148-61 (.708) overall record, six straight 20-win seasons and four NCAA Tournament appearances. Louisville advanced to the Elite Eight twice (2008 & 2009) during that time. Masiello played a vital role in building Louisville's 2009 Big East Championship team, which won 31 games, including a program record 16 in conference, and entered the NCAA Tournament as the No. 1 overall seed. One of the nation's most renowned recruiters, Masiello effectively directed the Cards' recruiting efforts by signing four Top-20 recruiting classes, which included four McDonald's All-Americans over his time in Louisville. The Cards' 2008 recruiting class garnered a No. 4 national ranking, featuring 2008 USA Today High School National Player of the Year and future NBA player Samardo Samuels.

Masiello was named one of the nation's Top 25 collegiate assistant coaches according to FoxSports.com (2010) & Rivals.com (2007). He managed the Cards' game preparation and scouting responsibilities for his last three years with the program as Louisville amassed a 76-29 (.724) overall record, including a 39-15 (.722) mark in the Big East during this stretch.

Masiello is back in Riverdale for his second coaching tenure at Manhattan. He previously helped lead the Jaspers to three postseason appearances in four years (2001-2005) as an assistant, which included two trips to the NCAA Tournament (2003 & 2004) and one to the NIT (2002). Under his tutelage, the Jaspers posted an 83-36 (.697) overall record and won the 2003 & 2004 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Championships. Masiello was a key contributor on the Jaspers' coaching staff which helped lead Manhattan to its third NCAA Tournament victory in program history in 2004, defeating Florida in the First Round. Prior to Manhattan, Masiello served as the administrative assistant at Tulane under head coach Shawn Finney for one year (2000-01).

A 2000 graduate of the University of Kentucky with a degree in communications, Masiello was a four-year member of the Wildcats' basketball team, playing under head coaches Rick Pitino (1996-97) and Tubby Smith (1997-2000). During his playing career, Kentucky went to the Final Four twice (1997 & 1998), advancing to the National Championship game both times and winning the title in 1998. Masiello was named the Wildcats' co-captain his senior year. Masiello hails from White Plains, N.Y., and attended Archbishop Stepinac High School. He completed his final two years at the Harvey School in Katonah, N.Y., where he helped the basketball program win the New England Prep School Athletic Association Championship. Masiello also served as a ball boy for the New York Knicks during his youth.
