News and Notes

Manhattan returns home for the first time in 18 days as the Jaspers played four straight road games, which included three against Atlantic 10 opponents. The Jaspers rolled to a 67-56 victory over Hofstra in their home opener on Nov. 21 with a game-high 29 points coming from senior guard George Beamon.

Prior to starting line ups, Manhattan women's basketball senior Maggie Blair will be recognized for being named to the 2012 Division I-AAA Athletic Directors Association Scholar Athlete Team. Blair was one of only 22 basketball student-athletes nationally to receive the prestigious accolade.

At halftime, Manhattan will present the 2012 MAAC Championship rings to the Jaspers' baseball team. Under first year head coach Jim Duffy, Manhattan won its second straight league title in historic fashion at Joe Bruno Stadium in Troy, N.Y. The Jaspers became the only team in MAAC history to win the double elimination tournament after losing game one and advancing through the elimination bracket.

Senior pitcher Taylor Sewitt captivated the college baseball world by his performance at the MAAC Tournament. Sewitt pitched 22 scoreless innings over three appearances in three days during the championship run. He won three of the four games Manhattan needed to capture its third crown in seven years. Sewitt posted 20 strikeouts in the tournament and was named the Most Valuable Player. He also received "Louisville Slugger's" National Player of the Week award presented by the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper.

2012-2013 Manhattan Men's Basketball Game Notes

Scouting Report Manhattan

The Jaspers begin a series of 10 games that will be played in the metropolitan area. After going on the road for six of their first seven contests, Manhattan enjoys a local stretch where they will not travel further than 20 miles with seven of the 10 contests played within the five boroughs.

In its only home game this season, Manhattan earned a 67-56 victory over Hofstra behind 29 points from senior guard George Beamon. Manhattan set season-highs against the Pride with a 45.5% field goal mark and 17 assists. Junior forward Rhamel Brown shot a perfect 7-for-7 from the field to finish with 15 points, while junior point guard Michael Alvarado added 12 points.

Manhattan is coming off a four-point loss (62-58) at Marist on Friday night in the MAAC opener without George Beamon who missed his third game this season with an injury. For the third time in seven games this year, the Jaspers got off to a slow offensive start shooting under 30% from the field in the first half. Alvarado scored a game-high 19 points, posting 14 in the second half as he helped mount a furious comeback that fell short. The Jaspers went 12 players deep as sophomores Donovan Kates and RaShawn Stores pitched in nine points apiece. Kates set a season-high with eight rebounds, anchoring Manhattan's 36-27 advantage on the glass.

The Jaspers have been much better in the second half this season shooting above 40% in all but one contest, including three games where they shot over 50%. Alvarado, a 6'2" Bronx native, has stepped up his game for the Jaspers in the clutch. He is averaging 8.1 of his 11.6 points per game in the last 20 minutes. Alvarado has shot 48.3% from the field and is 26-33 (78.8%) in the second half of seven appearances.

Siena

The Saints will play their next two games in the Bronx. After Sunday's match up with the Jaspers, Siena returns to the borough 13 days later to face Fordham. Siena is coming off a 62-56 loss to Rider on Friday at the Times Union Center in Albany. Senior forward OD Anosike posted a double-double (11 points, 10 rebounds) and sophomore guard Rakeem Brookins added 12 points off the Siena bench in his return from an injury.

Anosike is a 6'8", 241-pound forward from Staten Island who is averaging a double-double this season (12.7 points, 13.0 rebounds). He led the nation in rebound in 2011-12 with 12.5 boards per contest. Anosike currently leads the MAAC with a 56.2% field goal percentage, slightly ahead of Manhattan forward Rhamel Brown (55.1%).

Evan Hymes, a 2012 All-MAAC Rookie Team selection, is the second of four Saints who are averaging double-digits in scoring this year. Hymes has started all 10 games in the backcourt and is averaging 12.0 points. Sophomore forward Rob Poole has posted 11.8 points per game this season with a team-high 21 three-pointers.

The Saints rank 29th nationally in three-point field goal defense (26.2%).

Last Game

Marist 62, Manhattan 58

A furious Manhattan comeback attempt in the last 11 minutes fell short as the Jaspers lost 62-58 at Marist in their MAAC opener on Friday. Junior point guard Michael Alvarado scored 14 of his game-high 19 points during a 26-8 run late in the second half.

The Red Foxes were led by sophomore guard Chavaughn Lewis who scored 17 points. Devin Price (14), Jay Bowie (11) and Isaiah Morton (10) rounded out the four Marist players who contributed double-figures in the scoring column.

The Jaspers were without the services of leading scorer George Beamon (16.8 ppg) who missed his third contest this season with an ankle injury. Manhattan shot 36.0% (18-50) from the field and sank only 4-of-19 (21.1%) three-point attempts. Marist shot 50% (9-18) from downtown and went 46.2% from the field.

After shooting 52.4% (11-21) in the first half, Marist opened a 15-point lead (47-32) with 11 minutes to go in the second half. The Jaspers countered with the 26-8 surge over an eight minute span that resulted in Manhattan's first lead of the ball-game. Alvarado gave Manhattan a 58-55 advantage on a layup with three minutes to go.

Bowie quickly recaptured the momentum with his third three-pointer of the game to tie it at 58-58. Then four free-throws by Marist and a lack of execution by Manhattan on a key offensive possession proved to be the difference.

Last Meeting

Siena 84, Manhattan 82 (OT)

Manhattan dropped a heartbreaker to the Saints in the 2012 MAAC Tournament Quarterfinals falling 84-82 in overtime. Senior guard Kidani Brutus missed a potential game winning shot that revolved around the rim twice before falling off the mark at the end of regulation.

Siena got a big bucket and free-throw from Owen Wignot to take a two point advantage with 19 seconds remaining in overtime, which proved to be the difference. Wignot scored a team-high 22 points shooting 8-for-12 from the field.

George Beamon scored a game-high 24 points with five three-pointers for Manhattan. Teammate Emmy Andujar finished with a double-double scoring 11 points and grabbing 15 rebounds. Andujar also dished out six assists in the contest.

Siena's OD Anosike posted a double-double (14 points, 10 rebounds). The Saints shot nearly 50% from the field and 45% from downtown.

Series History

Manhattan and Siena meet for the 86th time in series history, and the 63rd time at the NCAA Division I level. The Jaspers own a nine game advantage in the MAAC rivalry which began in the 1946-47 season.

The Jaspers have won nine of their last 11 games with Siena in Riverdale, including their last two meetings. Last season, Manhattan ran off with a 72-53 victory on Jan. 14 behind 24 points from George Beamon. Jaspers' point guard Michael Alvarado dished out a career-high nine assists and guard Kidani Brutus had 14 points off the bench.

- ▶ Junior forward Rhamel Brown is second in the MAAC with a .551 field goal percentage
 - ▶▶ Brown is 10-for-11 (90.9%) shooting in wins and has averaged 11.0 points
- ▶ Manhattan is averaging 66 points in its two victories
 - ▶▶ The Jaspers have shot 45.3% in wins and held opponents to a 37.5% field goal mark

 - ▶▶ He guided the Jaspers to 21-wins, the second most for a rookie head coach in the program's 107-year history
 - ▶▶ Masiello was named the Jaspers' 23rd head men's basketball coach on April 11, 2011
 - ▶▶ He was the 9th youngest head coach in the nation in his first year at the helm
 - ▶▶ Masiello was an assistant coach at Manhattan College from 2001-2005 and helped guide the Jaspers to two MAAC Championships and NCAA Tournament appearances
- ▶ Jaspers' guard George Beamon led the MAAC in scoring in 2011-12 averaging 19.0 points per game last season
 - ▶▶ Beamon has scored in double-figures in 57 of the last 59 games dating back to the 2010-11
 - ▶▶ Beamon has scored 1,198 of his 1,278 career points over the last three seasons. He has averaged 17.6 points during this stretch.
 - ▶▶ Beamon's 626 points in 2011-12 were the 4th most for a single season in program history

Stores Bolsters Backcourt

First year guard RaShawn Stores averaged 7.3 points and 5.7 rebounds for the Jaspers in the last three games. With only seven collegiate games under his belt, the 5'11" Bronx native is developing into a solid contributor in multiple columns on the box score.

Stores anchored the Jaspers' largest rebounding advantage (+20) over a team this season on Nov. 29 by grabbing a game-high nine rebounds in a 65-58 win over Fordham. All nine boards came on the defensive glass, and it marked a career-high.

Last Sunday, Stores led Manhattan with 11 points, grabbed six rebounds and handed out three assists against George Washington. It matched his season-high scoring output that he set in his first collegiate game at Louisville.

Stores scored nine points and dished out a team-high three assists without committing a turnover against Marist on Friday. He shot 4-for-8 from the field in 26 minutes.

Climbing Scoring Chart

Jaspers' senior guard George Beamon has quickly climbed the program's career scoring chart in the last three seasons. Despite seeing limited action (6.9 mpg) and scoring only 80 points as a freshman, Beamon is within striking distance of advancing into the top-5 all-time.

Block Party

Jaspers' junior forward Rhamel Brown engraved his name in the Manhattan men's basketball record book. The 6'7" forward set the program's single season blocks record last season with 84 rejections. Brown's 2.47 blocks per game average ranked in the top-20 nationally in 2011-2012, leading the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference in this category for the second straight year.

In 2010-2011, Brown blocked 68 shots, which is the highest total ever by a Jasper freshman, leading the MAAC with 2.2 blocks per game.

Brown is second on the program's career blocks list and on pace to break the Manhattan record held by Steve Grant (220, 1974-78).

Beamon Among Top Returning Scorers in Nation

Manhattan guard George Beamon entered his final season in Riverdale ranked among the top returning scorers in the country. Beamon, the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference's (MAAC) reigning scoring champion, has finished in the top-3 of the league's chart the last two years. The 6'4" native of Roslyn, N.Y., averaged a career-high 19.0 point per game last season, which has landed him 7th place among all returning players in NCAA Division I. Beamon's 2011-2012 scoring average is also the 6th highest among returning seniors for the 2012-2013 campaign.

MAAC Player of the Week Honors

Manhattan senior guard George Beamon was named MAAC Player of the Week on Nov. 26 after averaging 24.0 points and 5.5 rebounds in the two contests against Hofstra and Dayton. Beamon shot 64% (16-25) from the field and 81.3% (13-16) at the free-throw line, making a seamless transition back into the starting lineup after missing the Jaspers' first two contests with an injury.

Beamon exploded for 29 points and grabbed seven rebounds to lead Manhattan to a 67-56 victory over Hofstra. He shot 10-for-15 (66.7%) from the field and it was his 19th career 20+point performance.

The Roslyn, N.Y., native continued his superb play at Dayton as he delivered his 50th straight double-figure scoring effort. Beamon finished with 19 points, four rebounds, three assists and three steals. He was 6-for-10 (60%) from the field and 6-for-6 at the free-throw line.

Manhattan Inks Three to NLI's

Manhattan signed three highly-touted student-athletes during the NCAA Early Signing Period. Former five-star recruit and elite junior college prospect Chris Thomas (Denver, Colo./Chipola College), along with incoming freshmen, 6'10" center Carlton Allen (Ewing, N.J./Life Center Academy) and 6'0" guard Tyler Wilson (Bronx, N.Y./Cardinal Hayes) signed their National Letters of Intent to play for the Jaspers in 2013-14.

Thomas is 6'5" shooting guard from Colorado who is regarded as one of the purest scorers in the nation with high-major talent. He will come to Manhattan after one season playing at Chipola College for head coach Patrick Blake in Marianna, Fla. Chipola was the preseason fourth ranked team in the country on the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) poll. Thomas was ranked as the #1 shooting guard and fifth overall prospect by Rivals.com and was an ESPN Super 60 recruit.

Allen comes to Manhattan from Life Center Academy in Burlington, N.J., where he plays for head coach Pervis Ellison, an 11-year NBA veteran. Allen is a 6'10", 240-pound student-athlete who provides a low post scoring threat for the Jaspers. He maneuvers well in the deep post and has a repertoire of inside moves, including the jump hook, according to ESPN.com. ESPN.com also ranks Allen as the 41st player at his position in 2013 class.

Wilson is a speedy guard who handles the ball well and is a legitimate scoring threat. He helped lead Cardinal Hayes to the Catholic High School Athletic Association (CHSAA) Class AA intersectional semifinals as a junior. He averaged approximately 12 points and seven assists per game last year, after playing two years at Rice High School.

Jasper Garners Preseason All-America Honors

Manhattan senior guard George Beamon was named to the Preseason Lou Henson All-America Team by CollegeInsider.com. The Lou Henson award is presented annually to the top mid-major player in college basketball. Norfolk State's Kyle O'Quinn received the honor in 2011-12. Beamon, a two-time All-MAAC selection, was joined by Siena's OD Anosike as the only players in the conference to receive the preseason recognition.

After only one season with Steve Masiello at the helm, Manhattan was picked to finish the 2012-13 campaign atop the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC), a position the program was familiar with during his time as an assistant coach (2001-2005). According to Yahoo! Sports and CBSSports.com, the Jaspers are the MAAC's preseason favorite. CBSSports.com also had Manhattan senior guard George Beamon as the projected conference Player of the Year.

The Jaspers were selected to finish as the league's runner up in 2012-13 as announced on ESPN3. Manhattan received two first place votes, and was eight points behind preseason favorite Loyola, the defending conference champion.

Preseason All-MAAC Honors

Manhattan had a league-best four players selected to the 2012-13 Preseason All-MAAC Team. Senior guard George Beamon was named to the First Team, while juniors Michael Alvarado, Rhamel Brown and sophomore Emmy Andujar received Third Team honors. These four Jaspers combined for 60% of the team's scoring last season and more than 50% of rebounding and assists for a squad that won 21-games.

Beamon is a two-time All-MAAC selection who was named to the First Team last year after leading the MAAC in scoring with 19.0 points per game. He posted double-figures in the scoring column in all 33 appearances in 2011-12 and led the team in points 26 times. Beamon ranked in the top-25 nationally for scoring average, and he finished in the top-10 of the MAAC for field goal percentage (48.5% - 10th), free-throw shooting (80.1% - 4th), steals (1.5 - 6th), three-point field goal percentage (42.7% - 4th) and three-point field goals (61 - 9th). Beamon scored 1,131 points in the previous two seasons.

Alvarado, a junior guard, was named to the All-MAAC Third Team in 2011-12. He started 26 of 30 appearances and tied for second on the team in scoring (8.5) and assists per game (3.2), which was also the sixth best average in the MAAC. Alvarado ranked among the leaders in the conference with a 76.6% free-throw percentage.

Brown is a 6'7" forward who earned the MAAC Defensive Player of the Year award last season. Brown led the MAAC with 2.5 blocks per game. He appeared in all 34 games for the Jaspers averaging 7.9 points and 4.9 rebounds in 19.1 minutes per game. He ranked second in the MAAC with a 60.1% field goal percentage.

Andujar was a MAAC All-Rookie Team selection in 2011-12. He started 32 of 33 appearances tying for second on the team in scoring with Alvarado (8.5 ppg). The 6'6" forward dished out a team-high 105 assists and led Manhattan with 189 rebounds.

Manhattan second-year head coach Steve Masiello reloaded his coaching staff for the 2012-2013 season after former assistants Scott Padgett and Rashon Burno earned elevated coaching positions at other NCAA Division I institutions. During the offseason, Padgett was named associate head coach at Samford University in Birmingham, Ala., and Burno became an assistant coach under two-time national championship head coach Billy Donovan at the University of Florida.

The Jaspers current staff still features Associate Head Coach Matt Grady, who enters his second season in Riverdale. He brings a plethora of high level collegiate experience from his time at Louisville, Cincinnati, Murray State and Morehead State. Grady oversees the primary scouting and game planning responsibilities. "Matt is one of the best basketball minds out there," says Masiello.

Masiello reunited with assistant coach Rasheen Davis, who joined the staff in April. Davis came to Riverdale from Xavier, where he spent the previous two years as an assistant coach on Chris Mack's staff. Davis helped the Musketeers to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, including a run to the Sweet Sixteen in 2011-12. He joined the Division I coaching ranks in 2007-08 as a program assistant at Louisville under head coach Rick Pitino and Masiello, who was an assistant on the staff.

Oliver Antigua is the third assistant on the Jaspers' staff. He joined the program in June after a successful career at St. Raymond High School in the Bronx, where he coached the Ravens to five Catholic High School Athletic Association (CHSAA) Class AA championships over his 13-year tenure. Antigua's brother Orlando is an assistant coach at Kentucky.

Jaspers in the Hall

Coinciding with the MAAC Championships moving to the MassMutual Center in Springfield, Mass., through 2014, a 600-square foot permanent display dedicated to the conference opened at the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in October 2011. The MAAC Experience includes historical items and artifacts from the MAAC's rich 32-year history. In addition, all 10 MAAC schools have their own display within the exhibit. Manhattan's display features a commemorative No. 23 jersey worn by former Manhattan player, coach and athletic director Jack Powers '58, the former Executive Director of the NIT. Powers was Manhattan's first men's basketball inductee to the MAAC Honor Roll in March at the 2012 MAAC Championships.

The 2013 MAAC Honor Roll Class will feature Manhattan standout Keith Bullock '93 who will be inducted into The MAAC Experience exhibit this March during the MAAC Tournament. The 1990 MAAC Rookie of the Year, Bullock helped lead a renaissance of Manhattan basketball. He was a key starter on the 1992 team that snapped the Jaspers' 15-year postseason drought by earning a berth in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT).

As a senior in 1993, Bullock was named the MAAC Player of the Year and MAAC Tournament MVP, as Manhattan won its first MAAC title and reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1958. A three-time First Team All-MAAC selection, Bullock finished his career with 1,992 points, 1,012 rebounds, ranking him second in program history on both lists.

#The6thBorough

#The6thBorough is the newly formed Official Manhattan Basketball Student Section in Draddy Gymnasium that made its debut at Manhattan Madness in October.

#The6thBorough was a concept developed by Student Government in conjunction with the Student Activities Office and the Athletic Department. #The6thBorough is located in the end zone closest to the visiting bench. Over 2,000 #The6thBorough t-shirts were distributed to students in an effort to organize involvement at basketball games and build a stronger home court advantage.

Manhattan All-Time Record

In its 107th season, the Manhattan College men's basketball program boasts a 1270-1136 (.528) overall record and 234-263 (.472) MAAC mark in 32 seasons as a conference member. The Jaspers' storied men's basketball team was established in 1904-05 and served a two-year hiatus due to World War II (1943-44 & 1944-45).

Jaspers at Draddy Gymnasium

Draddy Gymnasium has played host to several Jasper victories and memorable moments since it opened in 1978. Manhattan holds a 241-174 (.579) all-time record at Draddy Gymnasium.

What's a Jasper?

The unique nickname of Manhattan College's athletic teams, the Jaspers, comes from one of the College's most memorable figures, Brother Jasper of Mary, F.S.C., who served at the College in the late 19th century.

One of the greatest achievements of Brother Jasper was that he brought the then little-known sport of baseball to Manhattan College and became the team's first coach. Since Brother Jasper was also the Prefect of Discipline, he supervised the student fans at Manhattan College baseball games while also directing the team itself.

During one particularly warm and humid day when Manhattan College was playing a semi-pro baseball team called the Metropolitan, Brother Jasper noticed the Manhattan students were becoming restless and edgy as Manhattan came to bat in the seventh inning of a close game. To relieve the tension, Brother Jasper called time-out and told the students to stand up and stretch for a few minutes until the game resumed.

Since the College annually played the New York Giants in the late 1880's and into the 1890's at the old Polo Grounds, the Manhattan College practice of the "seventh inning stretch" spread into the major leagues, where it has now become a time-honored custom practiced by millions of fans annually.

Head Coach Steve Masiello Second Season (23-18)

Manhattan College head coach Steve Masiello has quickly restored the winning tradition to the storied men's basketball program in Riverdale, laying the foundation for the Jaspers' return to prominence. Masiello has rejuvenated the Jaspers with strong national recruiting that has transformed Manhattan into a top contender in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference for years to come.

Long-time ESPN college basketball commentator Dick Vitale has even noted, "Remember this name, Steve Masiello. A young, rising coach doing a great job at Manhattan."

Masiello was named Manhattan's 23rd head coach in program history on April 11, 2011. He arrived back in his native New York after spending six years in the Big East as an assistant at Louisville under head coach Rick Pitino.

In his first season at Manhattan, the Jaspers enjoyed the biggest turnaround in the nation, posting 21 victories in 2011-2012, a 15-win improvement from the previous season. It went down as the largest turnaround in program history, and he posted the second most wins by a Manhattan first-year head coach, trailing only Fran Fraschilla's 23 victories in 1992-93.

Masiello garnered Co-Coach of the Year honors by the Metropolitan Writer's Association in 2011-12 as he led Manhattan to its first postseason appearance since 2006. The Jaspers advanced to the Second Round of the CollegeInsider.com Tournament (CIT). Masiello mentored three All-MAAC selections in 2011-2012, including First Team honoree and the league's scoring champion George Beamon.

The Jaspers have also excelled in the classroom under Masiello. Three players earned both MAAC All-Academic distinction and the prestigious Honors Court recognition by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) in 2012. It marked the most student-athlete honorees on both award lists out of the 10 MAAC institutions.

Over his six-year tenure at Louisville, Masiello helped lead the Cards to a 148-61 (.708) overall record, six straight 20-win seasons and four NCAA Tournament appearances. Louisville advanced to the Elite Eight twice (2008 & 2009) during that time. Masiello played a vital role in building Louisville's 2009 Big East Championship team, which won 31 games, including a program record 16 in conference, and entered the NCAA Tournament as the No. 1 overall seed. One of the nation's most renowned recruiters, Masiello effectively directed the Cards' recruiting efforts by signing four Top-20 recruiting classes, which included four McDonald's All-Americans over his time in Louisville. The Cards' 2008 recruiting class garnered a No. 4 national ranking, featuring 2008 USA Today High School National Player of the Year and future NBA player Samardo Samuels.

Masiello was named one of the nation's Top 25 collegiate assistant coaches according to FoxSports.com (2010) & Rivals.com (2007). He managed the Cards' game preparation and scouting responsibilities for his last three years with the program as Louisville amassed a 76-29 (.724) overall record, including a 39-15 (.722) mark in the Big East during this stretch.

Masiello is back in Riverdale for his second coaching tenure at Manhattan. He previously helped lead the Jaspers to three postseason appearances in four years (2001-2005) as an assistant, which included two trips to the NCAA Tournament (2003 & 2004) and one to the NIT (2002). Under his tutelage, the Jaspers posted an 83-36 (.697) overall record and won the 2003 & 2004 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Championships. Masiello was a key contributor on the Jaspers' coaching staff which helped lead Manhattan to its third NCAA Tournament victory in program history in 2004, defeating Florida in the First Round. Prior to Manhattan, Masiello served as the administrative assistant at Tulane under head coach Shawn Finney for one year (2000-01).

A 2000 graduate of the University of Kentucky with a degree in communications, Masiello was a four-year member of the Wildcats' basketball team, playing under head coaches Rick Pitino (1996-97) and Tubby Smith (1997-2000). During his playing career, Kentucky went to the Final Four twice (1997 & 1998), advancing to the National Championship game both times and winning the title in 1998. Masiello was named the Wildcats' co-captain his senior year. Masiello hails from White Plains, N.Y., and attended Archbishop Stepinac High School. He completed his final two years at the Harvey School in Katonah, N.Y., where he helped the basketball program win the New England Prep School Athletic Association Championship. Masiello also served as a ball boy for the New York Knicks during his youth.
